I. INTRODUCTION

Chair Vargo called the meeting to order. Self-introductions were made. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. APPROVAL OF APRIL 3, 2014 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Berry made a motion to approve minutes. Mr. Kirkpatrick seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

None

IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of 2014 Amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan.

Mr. Lindsay referred to a memo on page 5 and presented information about the proposed amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan (AWQMP). MVRPC conducts water quality planning on behalf of Ohio EPA in our five regional planning counties, and maintains the AWQMP. The central element of the AWQMP is the Facility Planning Areas map, which details where centralized wastewater treatment will be provided (and by whom) and where wastewater will be handled through on-site treatment. Updates to this map are provided by the Designated Management Agencies through their own local planning processes. He explained how planning factors such as waste loads, local water quality and projected population are used to conduct wastewater treatment planning. The amendment before the Board includes the results of a population projection analysis for the facility planning areas in the AWQMP. Mr. Lindsay stated that using projections developed by the MVRPC and ODOT long range transportation planning process, traffic analysis zones were aggregated into the boundaries of the Facility Planning Areas to provide projections of future population within the planning areas. This method has the important result of making sure the AWQMP and the LRTP are based on the same planning assumptions for population. Mr. Lindsay displayed a map that color coded the population growth and decrease areas in the region. He noted that there are areas of expected high growth, particularly in southern Greene County that are not within a facility planning area at this time. Also noted were communities that were showing more growth at their peripheries, which may result in higher infrastructure construction and maintenance costs. He referred to a resolution on page 14 of the mailout.

Ms. Graff questioned if this plan in any way will change current planning boundaries of a service area, and Mr. Lindsay stated it would not. Ms. Wintrow asked how these growth projections were obtained, noting that they seemed somewhat inflated since most of the area, aside from Yellow Springs is almost entirely rural. Mr. Lindsay stated that 2010 Census data was used and these projections were part of the Long Range Transportation Planning (LRTP) process. Ms. Parikh noted that staff is required to follow population projections given by the Ohio Department of Development (ODOD) for each county. Mr. Lindsay reviewed the Facility Planning Area map in more detail, explaining the various degrees of projected growth. Mr. Mucher also shared concerns that the methodology explained is 180 degrees opposite of what the local jurisdictions project for the future, and he did not see the justification for this. Mr. Lindsay explained that the purpose is to make sure that the infrastructure plan uses the same data as the transportation plan in an effort to maintain a coordinated plan. He noted that the growth projections for the entire county are large, however, that does not obligate Yellow Springs to extend sewer services. Mr. Mucher stated he still did not agree with red areas of the map. Mr. Lindsay stated he could do additional research on the specifics. Mr. Martin noted that these projections were done in 2012 and will be re-visited in 2 years, at which time staff will be given county-wide projections by the DOD. Mr. Boeder noted that MVRPC's population projections for Montgomery County are 30,000 different than the state agency (ODOD), and felt this difference was rather significant. Mr. Lindsay stated that the transportation planning staff sought and received permission to modify the projections for planning purposes, and these projections were also used for the wastewater planning exercise. He clarified that the break outs by a facility planning area are populations within the planning area, and it is not assumed that all those people will necessarily be served by sewer. Mr. Church made a motion to approve. Ms. Graff seconded the motion. The motion passed with one no vote and 2 abstained.

V. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of a Surface Transportation Program (STP) Loan to the city of Marion-Modification

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 14 of the mailout, explaining that in January, the Board did approve this \$1,000,000 STP loan to the City of Marion. Staff has recently been notified that the City of Marion would like to increase the loan amount by \$100,000, with repayment over three state fiscal years, 2015, 2016 and 2017. He explained that this would be of benefit to MVRPC by reducing the amount of STP carry-over funds in SFY2014 which is subject to ODOT's Carryover Reduction Policy. Mr. Arnold stated that staff as well as TAC does recommend approval of the resolution on page 16. Ms. Wallace made a motion to approve. Mr. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 17 of the mailout explaining that numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects has resulted in the need for a TIP amendment. He referred to the project tables for each county as well as the areawide projects. Mr. Arnold stated that staff as well as TAC does recommend adoption of this TIP amendment, and referred to a resolution on page 31 of the mailout. Mr. Hankins made a motion to recommend adoption. Ms. Wintrow seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Dayton Regional Green (DRG) Overview

Mr. Steinbach stated that Ms. Mubaslat has agreed to reschedule the presentation due to the length of the meeting. He also announced that there was a good article in the AARP Periodical featuring the area trail system. There is a link on the MVRPC Facebook page, which can be re-posted to other websites. Mr. Steinbach also announced staff will begin holding Sustainability Roundtables, on a quarterly basis following TAC meetings. The first meeting will be on Energy Efficiency and co-sponsored by Dayton Regional Green after the September 18th TAC meeting.

VIII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin referred to a handout that provided information on his report. He provided an update on the current transportation funding bill, MAP-21 as well as the TIGER Grant program and declining revenue trends of the Highway Trust Fund. Mr. Martin reported on recent community visits during the second quarter at Preble County, Darke County, Greene Co. Twp. Association, Greene Co. Engineer's Annual Meeting, Mont. Co. Engineer's Annual Meeting, Franklin Twp. (Warren Co.) First Suburbs, Miami Township (Montgomery), Xenia Twp. (Greene) and Butler Twp. (Montgomery). The emphasis is placed on the many reasons to get involved in MVRPC above and beyond project funding. Mr. Martin also noted that MVRPC has been included in the Partnership Initiative launched by WPAFB serving as Senior Advisor to the transportation committee. His report also provided a list of upcoming meetings.

Ms. Wallace commented on a recent article in the Dayton Business Journal featuring an MVRPC staff person, Omar Peters, noting it was a very positive article.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Vogt made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Berry seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION AMENDING THE SFY2014-SFY2017 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation in cooperation with locally elected officials for Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties including the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin and Springboro in Warren County; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning process for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2014-SFY2017 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 2, 2013; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC and ODOT have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2014-SFY2017 TIP amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2014-SFY2017 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #12** to the <u>SFY2014-SFY2017 Transportation</u> <u>Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.
