The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors met on June 6, 2024 at 9:00 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

I. INTRODUCTIONS

Chairperson Lommatzsch called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m. Self-introductions were made and a quorum was confirmed for the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's Board of Directors meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. APPROVAL OF MAY 2, 2024 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Housh made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 2, 2024 Board meeting. Ms. Vonderhaar seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON ACTION ITEMS

None

IV. RTPO (REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 24-019: Adoption of the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan and Summary of Public Participation Meetings

Mr. Ramirez presented information regarding the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) for Darke, Preble, and Shelby Counties. She first shared the public comments made during the Public Participation Meetings held on March 25-27, 2024. Next, Ms. Ramirez shared information about the 2050 RTP and stated that the plan lists roadway, transit, bikeway/pedestrian, and transportation alternative projects that reflect the region's shared values from various stakeholders in the region, including local elected officials, planners, engineers, business community, special interest groups, and the general public. The plan also reflects current and projected land use patterns, regional demographics and economic, environmental, and traffic patterns. Lastly, Ms. Ramirez stated that after the RTP is adopted by MVRPC Board of Directors, staff will submit the plan to ODOT and the official RTPO Designation from the Governor is anticipated for SFY 2025. She then paused for any questions about the RTP plan or the public comments. Afterwards, Ms. Ramirez noted staff and the Regional Transportation Planning Organization Steering Committee (RTPOSC) recommend adopting the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan.

Ms. Vonderhaar made a motion to approve the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan. Mr. Barhorst seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Endorsement of ODOT District 8 – PRE I-70 Widening Project TRAC Application

Ms. Ramirez presented information on ODOT District 8's – PRE I-70 Widening Project TRAC application and explained that the proposed project will improve pavement conditions, significantly reduce congestion, and improve freight operations on this stretch of the I-70 corridor. Next, the floor was opened for questions. Lastly, Ms. Ramirez stated that staff and the RTPO Steering Committee recommend endorsing the ODOT District 8 PRE I-70 Widening Project TRAC Application.

Mr. Holmes made a motion to approve the endorsement of ODOT District 8 PRE I-70 Widening Project TRAC Application. Ms. Vonderhaar seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 24-020: Recommended Adoption of Amendment #8 to MVRPC's SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Arnold referred to the eighth amendment to the SFY 2024-2027 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He reviewed key project details for all local jurisdiction projects and tables by county. He paused for any questions about the statewide line item project tables or any projects. Afterwards, Mr. Arnold noted staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend adopting Amendment #8 to the SFY 2024-SFY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program.

Mr. Hankins made a motion to adopt Amendment #8 to the SFY 2024-SFY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program. Ms. Dodge seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VI. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Greater Region Mobility Initiative (GRMI) Plan Update 2024

Ms. Anderson provided information on the 2024 Greater Region Mobility Initiative (GRMI) plan update. She explained that the GRMI Transportation Coordination Plan is a roadmap for removing transportation barriers in an eight-county region. The eight counties participating in the GRMI include: Champaign, Clark, Darke, Greene, Miami, Montgomery, Miami, and Shelby County.

B. Air Quality Awareness & Rideshare Program Update

Ms. Dent provided an update regarding the Air Quality Awareness & Rideshare Program. She explained that both programs are funded by the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ). The goal of CMAQ-funded public education and outreach programs is to educate the public, community leaders, and potential project sponsors about trip planning and transportation mode choices, traffic congestion, and air quality.

VII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

A. Executive Director's Update

Chairperson Lommatzsch congratulated Mr. Martin on receiving the Pillar Award for the <u>Miami Valley Urban League</u> event on May 21, 2024. She thanked Mr. Martin for his service to the Region.

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #9** to the <u>SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation</u> <u>Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

Subject: Recommended Approval of MVRPC TRAC Projects for CY2024

Formed in 1997, by request of the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) is a permanent body of predominantly non-ODOT personnel, which administers the project ranking and selection process for all major new projects in Ohio. To learn more about the TRAC please visit their web site at: http://www.dot.state.oh.us/trac/Pages/Default.aspx.

Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) such as MVRPC have several responsibilities to fulfill for a project to be considered by the TRAC. The TRAC can only fund projects that are included or consistent with the MPO's Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). The TRAC also takes into consideration regional and local priorities by requesting MPOs to submit project priority lists. In addition, all projects need to be approved, reviewed, or commented on by the appropriate MPO.

In an effort to provide the TRAC a project priority list, the MVRPC Board adopted its *Policies and Procedures for Considering Major New Capacity Projects* (available at <u>www.mvrpc.org</u>) and MVRPC staff has completed its review of the single CY2024 TRAC project submitted this year in accordance with the Policy. The project we received is an excellent project and the entire Miami Valley strongly supports the completion of this project. MVRPC staff is forwarding this project to the MVRPC TAC and Board of Directors as a priority project for final approval prior to submittal to the TRAC.

Based upon the process summarized above, staff recommends the approval of the CY2024 MVRPC Recommended TRAC project list as shown in Exhibit 1.

It is my pleasure to announce that one MVRPC member organization, the City of Trotwood, has applied to receive a First Year Age-Friendly Responsive Grant from the DMH-Dayton Fund at The Dayton Foundation. The First Year Age-Friendly Community Responsive Grants will support communities beginning Phase 1 of the AARP Livable, Age-Friendly Communities multi-year planning effort. A summary of the applicant's proposal is as follow:

Community: City of Trotwood

Project Description: The City of Trotwood is interested in attaining the Age-Friendly designation because it represents a commitment to creating an inclusive, supportive, and respectful environment for all ages, improving the quality of life for older adults, while addressing needs and challenges, such as accessibility, social isolation, and healthcare access.

As noted in their application, Trotwood's progress related to age-friendly initiatives includes improvements in ADA accessibility, such as sidewalks, ramps, and public facilities. New affordable housing has also been developed for the older adult population. Further, Trotwood has assembled a steady stream of recreational and educational programming, specifically designed to address the needs of older adults.

Looking ahead, focus for future age-friendly improvements in Trotwood will include:

- Expanded transportation (more routes with more age-friendly seating at bus stops).
- Enhanced city park amenities, with the addition of age-friendly exercise equipment.
- Improved communication and information dissemination, ensuring that all materials are accessible and easy to understand.

Recommended Grant Amount: \$15,000

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Institute Steering Committee voted during their meeting on Friday, July 26, 2024 to recommend full funding for the amount requested for the 2024 Age-Friendly Community Responsive Grant; and

Legacy of Leadership: Reflecting on MVRPC's Journey with Dale Bertsch


On June 26, 2024, I had the honor of meeting Dale Bertsch, the first Executive Director of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC). This historic encounter allowed me to reflect on our agency's rich history and legacy while sharing personal stories and insights.

A Glimpse into Dale's Life

Dale Bertsch, now 92, resides in an assisted living facility in Atlanta. Despite some health challenges, Dale remains active and even drove us to dinner at J. Alexanders, where we enjoyed a meal and deep conversation. Dale moved to Atlanta to support his wife's health needs and to be closer to his daughters, one of whom adopted an African American baby—a fact that fills Dale with pride.

MVRPC's Growth Under Dale's Leadership

Dale's tenure as Executive Director began in 1964, with a starting salary of \$13,500. Under his leadership, MVRPC's budget grew from \$37,000 to \$3.5 million by 1979, and staff expanded from 3 to nearly 100 employees. Dale was instrumental in lobbying for MVRPC to be designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and keeping the agency's offices downtown, a decision that resonates as we prepare to move to our new home at 6 N. Main St.





A History of Advocacy

Dale's background in landscape architecture from Michigan State and his early experiences in the US Army shaped his lifelong commitment to diversity and inclusion. Dale shared numerous stories of standing against racial discrimination, both during his military service and his tenure at MVRPC. His advocacy extended to hiring several African American employees, including Minnie Johnson, who went on to hold significant regional planning and development positions.

Fair Housing and Departure from MVRPC



Under Dale's leadership, MVRPC adopted a fair housing plan, becoming a model for regional housing strategy. Dale's efforts resulted in MVRPC receiving \$2M annually from HUD for their affordable housing work. Other grants from HUD helped MVRPC to pay for the local plans and zoning ordinances that the agency worked on for our members during his time. This brought substantial funding to MVRPC, particularly from HUD, but the proposed budget cuts by the Reagan administration in 1979 prompted his departure. He then pursued a distinguished career as the Department Chair in Architecture and Planning at Ohio State University and as a consultant.

Reflections on Successor EDs

Dale shared his thoughts on his successors, noting the challenges and contributions of each. He highlighted the support of Art Haddad, who was instrumental in the search for subsequent Executive Directors, and praised Nora Lake for her advocacy for smaller communities within MVRPC.

In Conclusion

It was an honor and pleasure to visit with Mr. Dale Bertsch. The visit was very warm and cordial. After a couple of hours, I felt I had known Dale all my life. We had a good meal and took photos outside of the restaurant. Afterwards, we said our Good-Bye's and exchanged a hug.




There are four profiles, covering four
