The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors met on September 7, 2023 at 9:00 a.m. at Dayton Metro Library, 215 E. Third Street, Dayton, OH 45402. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

**I. INTRODUCTIONS**

Chairperson Simmons called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Self-introductions were made and a quorum was confirmed for the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's Board of Directors meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

**II. APPROVAL OF AUGUST 3, 2023 MEETING MINUTES**

Mr. Bruns made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 1, 2023 Board meeting. Mr. Housh seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**III. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON ACTION ITEMS**

None

**IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS**

**A. Resolution 23-034: Recommended Adoption of SFY2023 Transportation Work Program Completion Report**

Mr. Kim provided information on the SFY2023 Transportation Work Program Completion Report. He stated that the completion report summarizes the highlights of the MPO's transportation planning efforts for the preceding fiscal year (July 1 to June 30<sup>th</sup>). After Board approval, the report and the resolution are forwarded to the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). Mr. Kim then referred to the progress of each program. Lastly, Mr. Kim stated that staff recommends approval of the SFY2023 Transportation Work Program Completion Report.

Ms. Lommatzsch made a motion to approve the SFY2023 Transportation Work Program Completion Report. Ms. Wallace seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**V. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS**

**A. Resolution 23-031: Accepting the Federal Funding Agreement to Suballocate Federal 5307 Bus Urban Transit Funding within the Dayton Urbanized Area**

Ms. Ramirez explained after the 2020 U.S. Census, the Dayton Urbanized Area boundary was redrawn, and as a result, the Miami County Transit System is transitioning to a rural system and will no longer be eligible for 5307 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) urban transit funding. Ms. Ramirez then presented the revised signed agreement from the Greater Dayton Regional Transit Authority (RTA) and Greene County Board of Commissioners. She stated that the FTA has requested a new agreement be in place prior to the start of FFY 2023 on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. The staff and Technical Advisory Committee recommend approval of the agreement.

Mr. Walker made a motion to accept the Federal Funding Agreement to Suballocate Federal 5307 Bus Urban Transit Funding within the Dayton Urbanized Area. Ms. Clements seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.



## **B. Resolution 23-032: Recommended Adoption of Amendment #2 to MVRPC's SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program**

Mr. Arnold referred to the 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment to the SFY 2024-2027 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He referred to the packet showing the tables broken down by county as well as the statewide line item project tables. Mr. Arnold mentioned staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend adopting Amendment #2 to the SFY 2024-SFY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program.

Mr. Stroud made a motion to adopt Amendment #2 to the SFY 2024-SFY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program. Mr. Klepacz seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **C. IJA Funds Availability Report and Project Solicitation**

Mr. Arnold presented information on the IJA Funds availability report and project solicitation. He noted MVRPC staff evaluates existing transportation planning requirements and suggests changes to the agency's federal funding Program Policies and Procedures from time to time. MVRPC uses this document to solicit new projects. These Program Policies and Procedures require staff to provide an annual information report showing the status of regionally controlled federal transportation funds (Surface Transportation Program-STP, Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality-CMAQ, Transportation Alternatives-TA and Carbon Reduction-CR). He then referred to an attached table showing \$22.4M in regionally controlled federal funding are anticipated to be available from SFY 2024 – 2029 for the MPO. Lastly Mr. Arnold stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend Board approval for the solicitation request.

Ms. Wallace made a motion to approve the IJA Funds Availability Report and project solicitation. Ms. Byrge seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **D. Resolution 23-033: Updating MVRPC's Suballocated Funding Policy**

Mr. Arnold presented information on the most recent updates to the MVRPC Suballocated Funding Policy. He explained that MVRPC's suballocated funding policies and procedures were last updated in 2022 to include minor edits to reflect the availability of a resurfacing set aside, CMAQ funding, and CR funding. MVRPC staff has since determined that additional updates are necessary. He then showed the updates made in red text or strikethroughs in the policy document. Lastly, Mr. Arnold stated staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend Board approval of the updated policy.

Ms. Clements made a motion to approve the updated MVRPC's Suballocated Funding Policy. Mr. Greenwood seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

# **VI. INFORMATION ITEMS**

## **A. Ohio Commuter Challenge**

Ms. Henry provided information on MVRPC's Rideshare Program Ohio Commuter Challenge happening on September 11<sup>th</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup>. She explained that MVRPC's Rideshare Program along with the other Gohio Commute partners are hosting the Ohio Commuter Challenge to encourage commuters to log their sustainable commute trips to win prizes. She then shared the website link <https://www.mvrpc.org/transportation/drive-less-live-more> that will connect to the statewide [GohioCommute.com](https://www.gohiocommute.com) platform for participants to register and track their trips to earn a chance to win prizes. Lastly, Ms. Henry asked the MVRPC Board Directors to help promote the contest.

## **B. Changes in the Water Cycle and the Effects on the Landscape of the Miami Valley Region**

Mr. Mike Ekberg from the Miami Conservancy District (MCD) presented information on the [changes in the water cycle and the effects on the landscape of the Miami Valley](#). He first provided information on MCD's integrated system noting that the infrastructure is 101 years old and in need of rehabilitation investments. He then referred to various graphs that showed the trending data of the annual precipitation in the Great Miami River Watershed. He concluded with information about the water cycle speeding up which will result in more flooding and streambank erosion. He asked the MVRPC Board of Directors to think about ways to adapt to the changing water cycle effects and provided information on [stream setbacks](#). Lastly, Mr. Ekberg opened the floor for questions.

## **VII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

### **A. Executive Director's Update**

Mr. Martin shared the new [MVRPC Organizational Chart](#) and stated that we are currently in the process of filling the vacant Administrative Assistant position. He then shared that the renovations at Dayton Realtors are almost completed and we hope to host our November and December Board meetings in their newly renovated facility.

**RESOLUTION 23-036**

**WHEREAS**, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 4, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC, ODOT, Greene CATS, Miami County Transit and GDRTA have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP amendment; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

**WHEREAS**, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

**WHEREAS**, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #3** to the SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

## Rebuilding, Recovery, and Recognition: Miami Valley's Resilience Shines Bright

Following the devastating 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission has been at the forefront of efforts to restore and rebuild our region. We recently celebrated a significant achievement with RETREET, planting over 700 trees in homes and community parks, exemplifying community-driven recovery. The Disaster Recovery Leadership Board (DRLB), which included MVRPC Board members and leaders from

across the Region, recently concluded their oversight. Since inception, the DRLB safeguarded donated funds and a recovery process that resulted in over 93% property recovery and

These stories highlight our dedication to rebuilding and innovation, driven by the resilient Miami Valley community.

### Disaster Recovery Leadership Board

On September 15, 2023 the Disaster Recovery Leadership Board DRLB voted to end their oversight work related to the recovery of the 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes. Since March 2020, the board helped to guide and provide transparency to the recovery work. As a result of this strategic leadership and the strong commitment to ensure recovery as a top priority, property recovery rates exceed 93% and over \$660,000 to date has been allocated from the Greater Dayton Disaster Relief Fund to jurisdictions and programs to aid in restoring parks, removing



blighted structures damaged by the tornadoes, and planting trees at the homes of tornado survivors. MVRPC would like to thank the following delegates from the MVRPC Board of Directors who served on the DRLB: Woody Stroud (DRLB Chair), Sarah Hackenbracht, Tom Koogler, Chris Kershner, Mike Parks and Georgeann Godsey.

### **RETREET Community Celebration**

On September 22, 2023 MVRPC and RETREET celebrated the final planting to help restore the landscape of the Region from the 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes' devastation. Over the course of the last three years, more than 700 trees have been planted at homes across three counties, in over 15 communities and at two community parks. MVRPC staff and Board of Directors members attended the Community Celebration which was held following the planting to thank all those involved in the RETREET event.

### **MVRPC Receives 2023 URISA Exemplary Systems in Government (ESIG) Award**

MVRPC's "2019 Tornado Recovery Monitoring System" received the 2023 Urban and Regional Information Systems Association (URISA) Exemplary Systems in Government (ESIG) Award. The Urban and Regional Information Systems Association (URISA) Exemplary Systems in Government (ESIG) award recognizes outstanding achievement by government agencies in the use of geospatial information technology. This exemplary achievement is defined as the effective application of geospatial technologies and data that result in improved government service delivery and increased benefits to citizens.

The "2019 Tornado Recovery Monitoring System" was developed through our state of the art GIS technologies and staff expertise, allowing our region to address the critical need for an enhanced coordination effort involving many resource management agencies and 16 jurisdictions in a three-county area. Components of the "2019 Tornado Recovery Monitoring System" include: a region-wide database of affected people and properties; mapping applications for recovery coordination management; and public-facing recovery monitoring dashboards. These components provided critical data and information to recovery networks, elected officials, and the public. With these components, the "2019 Tornado Recovery Monitoring System" provided a framework to achieve an efficient, effective, and equitable way to distribute limited resources, and expedited recovery region-wide over the last four years.

### Miami Valley Advances to the Largest Age-Friendly Region in Ohio

The Coalition of Age-Friendly Communities in Ohio (CAFCO), headquartered in Columbus, serves as a dynamic hub for innovation and collaboration among the 28 communities currently enrolled in the AARP Livable Communities program. In October, the Miami Valley Age-Friendly Network crossed a major milestone, expanding to 13 communities, making our region the largest concentration of Age-Friendly communities in the state. ### Older Adults Symposium

On October 13th, Montgomery County's Frail and Elderly Services Advisory Committee hosted their inaugural Older Adults Symposium at the Kroc Center. 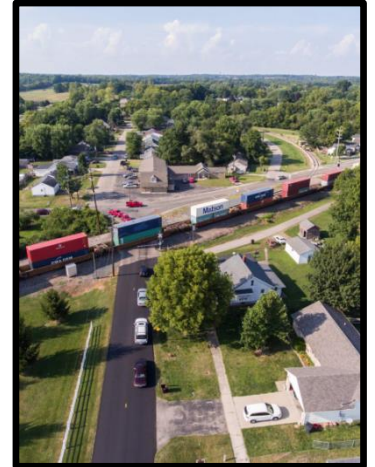

## Seeking Climate Pollution Reduction Project Nominations

With [Sustainability Solutions Group](#) now under contract to support Climate Pollution Reduction Planning for the Miami Valley, work is underway to develop the first required deliverable: the Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP). Due to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) by March 1, 2024, the PCAP will provide a high-level overview of greenhouse gas emissions in the Region and list near-term projects to address reducing those emissions.

EPA recently released the [Notice of Funding Opportunity](#) for the [Climate Pollution Reduction Implementation Grants](#). These competitive grants offer \$4.6 billion in funding for projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions across all sectors of the economy, including transportation, buildings and energy use, clean energy, agriculture, water, wastewater and solid waste, and land conservation. Eligible applicants are local governments. Projects must be listed in the PCAP to be eligible for funding.



MVRPC is interested in learning from our members what projects are in development in Miami Valley communities that should be considered for inclusion in the PCAP. Even if greenhouse gas reduction is not the primary purpose of the project, if it has a climate pollution reduction benefit, then it could be included in the PCAP and potentially access these implementation funds. EPA has provided a [list of example project types](#) that would be eligible for this funding.
