The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Technical Advisory Committee met on January 18, 2024 at 9:30 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

I. INTRODUCTION

Chairperson Goff called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m. Self-introductions were made.

II. APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER 16, 2023 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Hibner made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Mr. Hankins seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

None

IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 24-001: Recommended Approval of FY2025 Transportation and Governmental Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Projects

Mr. Daniel presented information regarding the projects submitted to the FY2025 Transportation and Governmental Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee. He stated MVRPC is the lead agency for transportation projects which include any surface, air. rail, transit, and pedestrian transportation-related projects. Seven FY2025 PDAC Transportation project applications, requesting \$33 million, were received by the November 3, 2023 deadline. MVRPC is also the lead agency for Government Services projects which include any emergency services, criminal justice, first responders, community and neighborhood infrastructure and K-12 education-related projects. Sixteen FY2024 PDAC Government Services project applications, requesting \$82 million, were received by the November 3, 2023 deadline. Mr. Daniel then stated the Transportation and Government Services projects were evaluated by a review panel on January 4, 2024. The MVRPC Review Panel is recommending seven transportation "Traditional" (Roadway)/ "Non-Traditional" (Bikeway) projects and sixteen Government Services projects for submittal to the Dayton Regional Priority Development and Advocacy Committee in the categorized order shown in Exhibit 1. Lastly, Mr. Daniel stated that staff recommends forwarding the FY2025 Transportation and Government Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Projects to the Board of Directors for approval.

Mr. Smith made a motion to forward to the FY2025 Transportation and Government Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Projects the Board of Directors. Mr. Gruner seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 24-002: Recommended Adoption of Amendment #5 to MVRPC's SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Arnold referred to the 5th amendment to the SFY 2024-2027 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He referred to the packet showing the tables broken down by county as well as the statewide line item project tables. Mr. Arnold mentioned staff recommends forwarding Amendment #4 to the SFY 2024-SFY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program to the Board of Directors.

Mr. Smith made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for adoption. Mr. Swanson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Resolution 24-003: Endorsing the Proposed 2020 Federal Aid Urbanized Area Boundary

Mr. Lee presented information regarding the proposed 2020 Federal Aid Urbanized Area Boundary. He explained that MVRPC staff has been working with ODOT on the Proposed 2020 Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary update and every ten years after the Census, the Federal Aid Urbanized Area Boundaries must be updated. He then referred to the map highlighting the proposed area boundary and compares to the 2010 Census Urbanized Boundaries. He then explained some of the changes including a retraction in parts of Bath Township in Greene County. Mr. Lee then stated that staff recommends forwarding the proposed 2020 Federal Aid Urbanized Area Boundary to the Board of Directors for final approval.

Mr. Sheridan made a motion to forward the proposed 2020 Federal Aid Urbanized Area Boundary to the Board of Directors. Mr. Grogean seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VI. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Climate Planning: Draft PCAP Now Available

Mr. Lindsay presented an update on the <u>Draft Priority Climate Action Plan</u> (PCAP). He first explained the process of the PCAP and referred to the slide deck prepared by their project consultant, Sustainability Solutions Group (SSG). He then stated that the primary objective of the PCAP is to list projects that could go forward with an implementation grant to reduce Green House Gas (GHG) emissions. Mr. Lindsay then provided an overview of the GHG inventory and showed various graphs explaining the data of the overall GHG emissions. Next, Mr. Lindsay announced the list of the PCAP Priority Projects and explained how the projects were weighed using the priorities for the PCAP measures. Lastly, Mr. Lindsay shared the recommendations and next steps.

VII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin announced that MVRPC was awarded the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant in December 2023. MVRPC staff will work with and provide frequent updates to the Technical Advisory Committee as we move forward. He then introduced MVRPC's Principal Planner, Ms. Elizabeth Whitaker as the Safe Streets for All project manager. Lastly, he invited the TAC members to attend the SS4A webinar hosted by the FHWA which will provide an introduction to the SS4A program and describe key next steps in developing and executing grant agreements.

RESOLUTION 24-007

AMENDING THE SFY2024-SFY2027 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation in cooperation with locally elected officials for Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties including the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning process for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 4, 2023; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC, ODOT, and Miami County Transit have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

Subject: Final Draft Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP)

The final draft version of the Priority Climate Action Plan for the Miami Valley is ready for review and approval ahead of its submission to US EPA. This memo provides an overview of the contents of the PCAP, and a review of the recently-completed public comment period.

BACKGROUND

The PCAP is the first of three required deliverables under the Climate Pollution Reduction Planning Grant (CPRG) received by MVRPC in summer 2023. The CPRG program covers the Dayton-Kettering MSA – that is Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties. The required elements of a PCAP include a greenhouse gas inventory, quantified greenhouse emissions reduction measures, an analysis of benefits for low income or disadvantaged communities, and a review of authority to implement the measures. The PCAP is due to US EPA no later than Friday, March 1, 2024.

MVRPC conducted a national search for consultant support for this project and completed a contract with the team of Sustainability Solutions Group and New Reach Community Consulting in September of 2023. Work commenced immediately and the final draft PCAP, developed in less than five months, is the result of a very productive partnership with these firms.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

MVRPC released the draft PCAP for a thirty-day public comment period on January 11, 2024. All elements of MVRPC Public Participation Policy were adhered to for this process:

- Public notice was published in the Dayton Daily News.
- All materials available for review and comment were available for download from the MVRPC web site, or to review in hard copy at the MVRPC offices.
- Online and hard copy comment forms were made available. Comments could also be directly emailed to Matt Lindsay, MVRPC's Manager of Environmental Planning.
- An extensive social media effort was undertaken to raise awareness of the availability of the PCAP for review.
- A virtual public meeting was held on Thursday, February 1, 2024 from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. At its peak, attendance at the public meeting was 51 persons.
- Comments on the draft PCAP were accepted through Friday, February 9, 2024. As of

February 7, 15 comments had been received.

• A complete Public Participation Summary Report will be created for the process.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS

Comments related to the quantified greenhouse gas reduction measures resulted in the most visible updates to the draft PCAP.

- A measure listed in the draft PCAP for Wastewater Treatment improvements in Greene County was withdrawn from the final draft with the concurrence of Greene County Sanitary Engineering. This is because the proposed program design (sludge drying) was determined to result in higher emissions of greenhouse gases than the existing process for handling wastewater sludge (landfilling).
- A measure for diversion of food waste from landfilling to anaerobic digestion was added to the final draft PCAP based on a request from Montgomery County Environmental Services. The proposed program will focus on adding regional infrastructure for organic waste collection and composting along with increasing capacities at existing facilities, in support of Montgomery County's Food Equity Plan.
- A measure to promote low- or reduced-carbon approaches to roadway construction was reviewed and then held over for further study and potential inclusion in the Comprehensive Climate Action Plan, which is due in spring of 2025.

Several commenters suggested that preference should be given to greenhouse gas reduction measures that also reduce other pollutants, such as the emissions that lead to ozone smog and particulate matter pollution. There was a comment regarding the low income and disadvantaged communities' benefits analysis related to the park district EV Fleet measure – suggesting additional Census tracts that may be impacted by that effort. Finally, there were numerous comments pointing out typographical or grammar errors.

The final draft PCAP presented now has been updated to reflect the comments received. Staff recommends the Technical Advisory Committee and Board of Directors approve the final draft PCAP for submission to US EPA.





An Informative Session on Progress in Securing Funding for Passenger Rail Service

All Aboard Ohio (AAO) recently hosted an informative session on January 11, 2024 at the Dayton Metro Library. The event was aimed at providing an update on the significant strides made in the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) process, a crucial step in securing funding for passenger rail service in Ohio.

The session was attended by a diverse group of stakeholders, including community leaders, transportation enthusiasts, and concerned citizens. During the event, AAO shared its progress in navigating the FRA process, demonstrating confidence in its ability to move forward successfully.



One of the key highlights of the event was the unveiling of future plans and an in-depth discussion of the next steps in the FRA process. Attendees were given insights into bringing passenger rail service to Ohio, which holds the promise of enhancing transportation options and connectivity across the state.

In addition to the FRA updates, AAO also delved into the outcomes of its 3C&D Economic Impact Analysis, conducted to evaluate the potential economic advantages of initiating passenger rail service in Ohio. The findings from this analysis indicated that the introduction of a passenger rail service could have a significant positive impact on Ohio's economy.

For those who missed this event, stay tuned for future opportunities to engage with MVRPC and be part of our ongoing efforts to enhance transportation options in the Miami Valley region and beyond. Together, we can make passenger rail service in Ohio a reality!
