The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Technical Advisory Committee met on November 16, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Chairperson Goff called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m. Self-introductions were made.

#### II. APPROVAL OF OCTOBER 19, 2023 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Huelskamp made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Mr. Gruner seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

None

#### IV. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 23-038: Supporting the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act Safety Performance Management Targets

Ms. Ramirez presented information regarding the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Safety Performance Management Targets. She explained that after a state DOT adopts targets for a particular rule, MPO's have 180 days from the date targets are established by a state to adopt their own targets or support the state's. MVRPC has decided to support the State's targets for the safety measures. Ms. Ramirez then summarized the safety measures and targets including the impact that a 2% reduction for CY 2024 has on target crashes. The CY 2023 target maintains the rate adopted in CY 2023 due to Governor DeWine's focus on safety and associated increases in funding. Lastly, Ms. Ramirez stated that staff recommends forwarding the resolution supporting the IIJA Safety Performance Management Targets to the Board of Directors.

Mr. Hankins made a motion to recommend forwarding the resolution supporting the IIJA Safety Performance Management Targets to the Board of Directors for adoption. Mr. Swanson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### B. Resolution 23-036: Recommended Adoption of Amendment #4 to MVRPC's SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Daniel referred to the 4<sup>th</sup> amendment to the SFY 2024-2027 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He referred to the packet showing the tables broken down by county as well as the statewide line item project tables. Mr. Daniel mentioned staff recommends forwarding Amendment #4 to the SFY 2024-SFY 2027 Transportation Improvement Program to the Board of Directors.

Ms. Rhoades made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for adoption. Mr. Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### V. INFORMATION ITEMS

#### A. Proposed New Projects Requesting MVRPC's STP, TA and CR Funds

Mr. Daniel presented information on the proposed new projects received as part of MVRPC's solicitation for regionally controlled funding under the Surface Transportation Program (STP), Transportation Alternatives (TA), and Carbon Reduction (CR) programs. He then referred to the table outlining CY2023 Summary of STP applications. Mr. Daniel then stated that a public involvement meeting to present the proposed new projects was held on November 9, 2023 and no comments were received during the public comment period.

Lastly, Mr. Daniel explained that the next step in the process is to evaluate each proposed project based on the criteria established in MVRPC's suballocated funding policies and procedures. After each project is ranked, a final list of recommended projects will be reviewed by the TAC in February and then forwarded to the Board for final approval in March.

#### **B. Going Places Implementation Tools Progress Update**

Mr. Kim presented a progress update regarding the <u>Going Places</u> Implementation Tool A, Regional Geographic Information System. He first shared information on the data available for the Miami Valley Region and shared images of the following websites: <u>Miami Valley Geo-Spark</u>, <u>US Census Data</u>, and <u>MVRPC's D-Hive</u>. Next, Mr. Kim provided information on how MVRPC's GIS staff can be a wonderful resource for members along with maps, applications and Dashboards they create and the classes and GIS trainings they provide. Lastly Mr. Kim presented examples of some of the GIS Presentations and Awards received such as the most recent 2023 URISA Exemplary Systems in Government (ESIG) Award. Mr. Kim then opened the floor for questions. Mr. Martin thanked Mr. Kim and his department for their work on the

2019 Tornado Recovery Monitoring System and also thanked the TAC for submitting their disaster recovery data needed to create the monitoring system.

#### C. Drive Electric Dayton: Partners for an Electric Future

Mr. Hankins thanked MVRPC and the TAC for the opportunity to present information about <a href="Drive Electric Dayton">Drive Electric Dayton</a>. He introduced Mr. Chris Celek, an organizing committee member of Drive Electric Dayton. Mr. Celek thanked Mr. Hankins for the introduction and then presented the Drive Electric Dayton's update. He first provided an overview on the region's history related to electric vehicles (EVs) over the years. He then shared some of the most <a href="recent events">recent events</a> that Drive Electric Dayton has hosted or attended. Next, Mr. Celek discussed the importance of community partnerships and recognized a few of their current partners. Next, Mr. Celek explained the importance of equity as it relates to EVs and referred to a map showing EV Equity in Ohio. Lastly, Mr. Celek provided information on EV charging and asked the TAC to think about updates to codes as it relates to wringing for EV charging. Mr. Celek then opened to floor for questions and discussed <a href="EV">EV</a> home charging.

**Subject**: FY2025 Transportation and Government Services Priority Development and

Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Projects

The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is working with other organizations throughout the Miami Valley to identify projects that may be eligible for funding. This group, the Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee, has developed a process for soliciting projects for consideration of funding through the legislative process. Through a committee decision, the top projects are forwarded on to elected officials for deliberation.

MVRPC is the lead agency for Transportation projects, which include any surface, air, rail, transit, and pedestrian transportation-related projects. Seven FY2025 PDAC Transportation project applications, requesting \$33 million, were received by the deadline of November 3, 2023 (see attached Exhibit 2).

MVRPC is also the lead agency for Government Services projects, which include any emergency services, criminal justice, first responders, community and neighborhood infrastructure and K-12 education-related projects. Sixteen FY2025 PDAC Government Services project applications, requesting \$143.8 million, were received by the deadline of November 3, 2023 (see attached Exhibit 3).

The Transportation and Government Services projects were evaluated by a review panel on January 4, 2024. The Review Panel then categorized the projects into Priority, Recommended, and Reviewed. The MVRPC Review Panel is forwarding seven Transportation "Traditional" (Roadway)/"Non-Traditional" (Bikeway) projects and sixteen Government Services projects for submittal to the Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee in categorized order as shown in Exhibit 1. A resolution endorsing these recommendations is attached for your consideration.

The list of projects is now being sent to the MVRPC Board structure for final review and adoption and submittal to the Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee.



WHEREAS, MVRPC, ODOT, and GDRTA have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP amendment; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

**WHEREAS**, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #5** to the <u>SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

**Subject:** Proposed 2020 Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary Update

MVRPC staff has been working with ODOT on the Proposed 2020 Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary update. Every ten years after the Census Urbanized Area is defined, the Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundaries must be updated. This is the first step in updating the functional classification for all roads contained within the new Urbanized Area Boundary.


Enclosed is one map highlighting the proposed 2020 Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary as well as showing the 2010 Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary. The boundary is being extended in various locations to reflect the 2010 Census designated boundary as well as additional extensions to smooth out irregularities, maintain administrative continuity of peripheral routes, and encompass fringe areas having residential, commercial, industrial, and/or national significance. At a minimum, the Dayton Urbanized Area Boundary fully encompasses the 2020 Census Urbanized Area, the incorporated areas of all jurisdictions that are partially or wholly within the 2020 Census Urbanized Area, and the entire 2010 Urbanized Area Boundary.

A resolution endorsing the Proposed 2020 Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary Update is attached for your review and consideration. The MVRPC staff recommends your approval of the Proposed 2020 Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary.




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


## Emissions by sector




# **Emissions by sub-sector**

# Overall GHG emissions - CO<sub>2</sub>




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# Overall GHG emissions - $CH_4$




# Overall GHG emissions - $N_2O$





