**The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Technical Advisory Committee met on May 18, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. at the University of Dayton Fitz Center for Leadership in Community, 1401 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.**

**I. INTRODUCTION**

Chairperson Goff called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Self-introductions were made.

**II. APPROVAL OF APRIL 20, 2023 MEETING MINUTES**

Mr. Smith made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Mr. Walker seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**III. Public Comment Period on Action Items**

None

#### **IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS**

##### **A. Resolution 23-026: Approving MVRPC's Title VI Program**

Mr. Juin provided information on MVRPC's recently updated Title VI Program. He stated that MVRPC is required to provide assurances that it will carry out the program in compliance with the Department of Transportation Title VI regulations. For MVRPC, Title VI compliance assurances include transportation planning, public participation and administration processes. Lastly, Mr. Juin stated that MVRPC staff recommend forwarding MVRPC's Title VI Program to the Board of the Directors for adoption.

Mr. Hankins made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for adoption. Mr. Conway seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

##### **B. Resolution 23-027: Amending Chapters of the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan and Select FPA Boundaries**

Mr. Lindsay provided information on the amendments to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan and Select FPA Boundaries. He stated that resulting from MVRPC's State Fiscal Year 2023 contract with Ohio EPA for water quality planning assistance and from requests by MVRPC member jurisdictions, this staff-proposed amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan (AWQMP) includes three elements. There are two text updates to the plan: a complete update to Chapters 5 and 6, combining them into a new single chapter on non-point source programs, and a review and update of Chapter 10 regarding wastewater treatment planning. Also there is a minor Facility Planning Area (FPA) update to the boundary between the Tri-Cities and Fairborn FPAs. Mr. Lindsay stated that MVRPC staff recommends forwarding the amended Chapters of the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan and Select FPA Boundaries to the Board of Directors for adoption.

Mr. Turnbull made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for adoption. Ms. Rhoades seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **VI. INFORMATION ITEMS**

##### **A. Program Outreach and Partners**

Ms. Henry provided information on MVRPC's Marketing and Public Outreach programs. She first discussed the programs funded by the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program (CMAQ). She then provided information on the Rideshare Program, GohioCommute.com, MiamiValleyRoads.org, and the Drive Less Live More campaign. Next, Ms. Henry discussed the Air Quality Awareness Program and explained how the public is notified with air quality alerts. Ms. Henry then provided a list of all the Media Partners and shared an example on the agency's return on investment. Lastly, Ms. Henry shared that MVRPC members can receive support through the Rideshare and Air Quality Awareness programs.

##### **B. Going Places Implementation Tools Progress Update**

Mr. Kim provided an update regarding MVRPC's Going Places Implementation Tools. He explained how MVRPC can assist members with local community planning support, regional geographic information system (GIS) services, and regional data profiles. Mr. Martin then stated that MVRPC staff is a multi-disciplinary team with expertise on transportation planning, land use planning, environmental planning, strategic planning, GIS and other planning support system, data analysis and mapping, best practices research, group facilitation, and grant

members such as partnering on projects, hosting public and/or training workshops, attending community events, and joining steering committees.

## **VII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Mr. Martin provided an update on the Safe Streets for All grant application. He briefly outlined the narrative and then explained that he will work with ODOT to request a local match. The application is due July 10<sup>th</sup> and a request for a letter of support will be emailed to MPO communities.

**WHEREAS**, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

**WHEREAS**, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #1** to the SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

**Subject:** Recommended Approval of MVRPC TRAC Projects for CY2023

Formed in 1997, by request of the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) is a permanent body of predominantly non-ODOT personnel, which administers the project ranking and selection process for all major new projects in Ohio. To learn more about the TRAC please visit their web site at: <http://www.dot.state.oh.us/trac/Pages/Default.aspx>.

Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) such as MVRPC have several responsibilities to fulfill for a project to be considered by the TRAC. The TRAC can only fund projects that are included or consistent with the MPO's Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). The TRAC also takes into consideration regional and local priorities by requesting MPOs to submit project priority lists. In addition, all projects need to be approved, reviewed, or commented on by the appropriate MPO.

In an effort to provide the TRAC a project priority list, the MVRPC Board adopted its *Policies and Procedures for Considering Major New Capacity Projects* (available at [www.mvrpc.org](http://www.mvrpc.org)) and MVRPC staff has completed its review of the single CY2023 TRAC project submitted this year in accordance with the Policy. The project we received is an excellent project and the entire Miami Valley strongly supports the completion of this project. MVRPC staff is forwarding this project to the MVRPC TAC and Board of Directors as a priority project for final approval prior to submittal to the TRAC.

Based upon the process summarized above, staff recommends the approval of the CY2023 MVRPC Recommended TRAC project list as shown in Exhibit 1.

Subject: Updates on the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant

### Background

The Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) program provides funding through the *Inflation Reduction Act* for planning activities related to reducing air pollution related to greenhouse gas emissions. MVRPC applied on behalf of the Region for a \$1 million grant to conduct climate action planning for the Dayton metro area over four years.

### Grant Approval Status and Timeline

Since last reporting on the progress of this grant (April/May) MVRPC staff completed the full application package and submitted it to US EPA on May 31, 2023. Staff has since received and responded to a couple of rounds of questions from US EPA clarifying elements of the proposed scope of work and budget. From the most recent communication from US EPA Region 5 in Chicago, we understand our submission was approved and MVRPC should be entering into a cooperative agreement with US EPA in the next month.

The grant program requires some ambitious timelines. The first set of deliverables, the Priority Climate Action Plan, is due by March 1, 2024. The second and larger set of deliverables, the Comprehensive Climate Action Plan will be due two years after the date of the Cooperative Agreement with US EPA. Please see the attached timeline chart for the full set of required deliverables and their due dates.

### Request For Proposals Released July 6, 2023

While we wait for the grant agreement between MVRPC and US EPA to be finalized, staff has been working to develop and release a Request for Proposals (RFP) package seeking consultant support for the work. The RFP is available on the MVRPC web site and has also been posted on the Ohio Department of Transportation's LPA Bids page, the American Planning Association's RFP list page, and on BidPrime.com. We have received a couple of inquiries about the RFP, and staff will continue to seek opportunities to make qualified and interested firms aware of the opportunity. We are hopeful of having a good pool of proposals by the deadline of August 17, 2023. The intention is to have a firm or team of firms under contract in September to get the work underway.

### Water and Environment Subcommittee

To guide and comment upon the climate action planning work, it will be important to have a body that represents our members as well as experts and advocates from across our Region. MVRPC staff has decided, rather than standing up a new advisory committee for this effort, to broaden the scope of the wastewater DMA committee (the Areawide Facility Planning Subcommittee) to encompass the full range of environmental issues that may confront MVRPC. This new Water and Environment Subcommittee will include all the representatives from the wastewater committee but also representatives of local environmental organizations, and academia. It will fulfill the role of the former committee with respect to the water quality plan, but also be able to address the CPRG work, and other environmental matters that come before our Region.

The first meeting of the Water and Environment Subcommittee will be **Wednesday, August 9, 2023 at 1:00 p.m.** This will be a hybrid meeting with both in-person and remote attendance options.

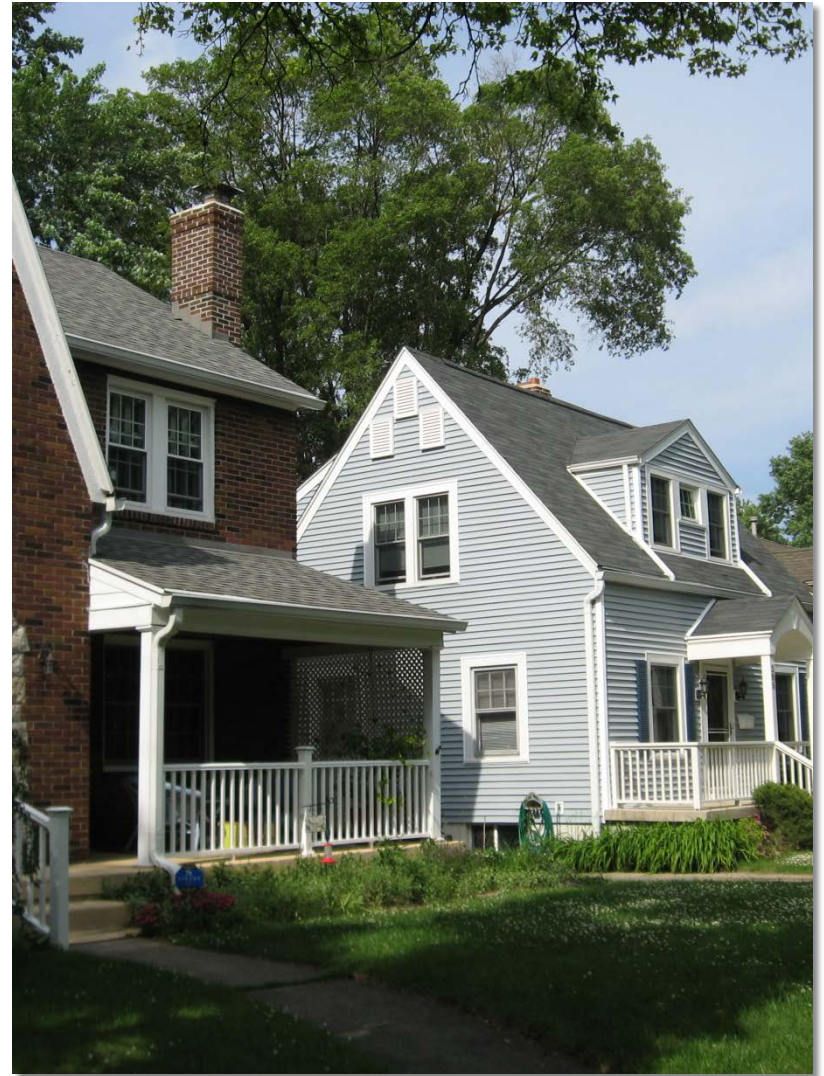
