I. INTRODUCTION

Chair Geyer called the meeting to order. Self-introductions were made.

II. APPROVAL OF APRIL 17, 2014 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Vagedes made a motion to approve minutes. Mr. Gorman seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

None

IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Recommended Approval of 2014 Amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan.

Mr. Lindsay presented information about the proposed amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan (AWQMP). MVRPC conducts water quality planning on behalf of Ohio EPA in our five regional planning counties, and maintains the AWQMP. The central element of the AWQMP is the Facility Planning Areas map, which details where centralized wastewater treatment will be provided (and by whom) and where wastewater will be handled through on-site treatment. Updates to this map are provided by the Designated Management Agencies through their own local planning processes.

He explained how planning factors such as waste loads, local water quality and projected population are used to conduct wastewater treatment planning. The amendment before the Board includes the results of a population projection analysis for the facility planning areas in the AWQMP. Mr. Lindsay stated that using projections developed by the MVRPC and ODOT long range transportation planning process, traffic analysis zones were aggregated into the boundaries of the Facility Planning Areas to provide projections of future population within the planning areas. This method has the important result of making sure the AWQMP and the LRTP are based on the same planning assumptions for population. Mr. Lindsay displayed a map that color coded the population growth and decrease areas in the region. He noted that there are areas of expected high growth, particularly in southern Greene County that are not within a facility planning area at this time. Also noted were communities that were showing more growth at their peripheries, which may result in higher infrastructure construction and maintenance costs. He referred to a resolution on page 13 of the mailout. Mr. Weaver made a motion to approve. Mr. Eastman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Recommended Approval of a Surface Transportation Program (STP) Loan to the city of Marion-Modification

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 14 of the mailout, explaining that in January, the Board did approve this \$1,000,000 STP loan to the City of Marion. Staff has recently been notified that the City of Marion would like to increase the loan amount by \$100,000, with repayment over three state fiscal years, 2015, 2016 and 2017. He explained that this would be of benefit to MVRPC by reducing the amount of STP carry-over funds in SFY2014 which is subject to ODOT's Carryover Reduction Policy. Mr. Arnold stated that staff does recommend approval of the resolution on page 15. Mr. Steeber made a motion to approve. Ms. Swan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Recommended Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 16 of the mailout explaining that numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects has resulted in the need for a TIP amendment. He referred to the project tables for each county as well as the areawide projects. Mr. Arnold stated that staff does recommend adoption of this TIP amendment, and referred to a resolution on page 26 of the mailout. Mr. Vagedes made a motion to recommend adoption. Mr. Hammes seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VI. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Dayton Regional Green (DRG) Overview

Mr. Steinbach introduced Ms. Lamees Mubaslat from Dayton Regional Green to provide an overview of this program. Ms. Mubaslat explained that sustainability is a balance among the need to: grow our economy, protect the environment and to be socially responsible. She reviewed programs available to participate in a green initiative including the Green Business Certification Program. Ms. Mubaslat reviewed facts showing how 30% of buildings are used inefficiently which is 60% more waste than in the 1960's. She shared data showing that the next generations of consumers are the most socially conscious consumers to date, and provided examples of how sustainability is a smart business decision. Ms. Mubaslat reviewed many programs available and how certified green businesses have begun to offer exclusive discounts and rates to their fellow certified businesses.

She also shared networking opportunities where companies can join a growing network of businesses and organizations who are leading our region toward an exciting, green future. She stated that a Green Business Directory is available on-line at DRG3.org.

VI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin referred to the May Executive Director's report on page 27. He reported on the MVRPC Annual Spring Dinner which was a very successful event. There were over 325 attendees and Mayor Michael Beamish was presented the Regional Steward Award. He also reported that MVRPC provided comments on the Ohio CMAQ Policy during the April 23 meeting with ODOT leadership in Columbus. Mr. Martin also reviewed a list of CMAQ projects that are being recommended for funding. The goal is to obtain maximum funding for our region. Mr. Martin congratulated participants involved in campaigning for the SCIP program that was passed in the recent election, as well as other local community issues that were approved. He also provided an update on the current Transportation Bill which is currently before the Senate Committee and may be forwarded to the full Senate. Staff will keep the committee updated on any changes. His report also provided a list of upcoming meetings.

VII. ADJOURNMENT

Ms. Swan made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Peters seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

WHEREAS, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning process for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2014-SFY2017 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 2, 2013; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC and ODOT have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2014-SFY2017 TIP amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2014-SFY2017 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #12** to the <u>SFY2014-SFY2017 Transportation Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

Solicitation for ODOT Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) projects began on April 1, 2014. As of the May 30th application deadline, MVRPC received three applications, which include:

MVRPC staff started reviewing these prospective projects on May 30th. Staff released the draft rankings to the project sponsors on July 16th. MVRPC staff will be hosting a Project Sponsor Meeting at 10:00a.m., July 22nd at MVRPC's main office. Please contact Brad Daniel at 1 S. Main Street, Suite 260, or 531-6543 for more information. The purpose of this Project Sponsor meeting will be to answer any questions or discuss any discrepancies between the project sponsor and staff scoring, and to reach a consensus. Following the ranking of the projects, MVRPC staff and the project sponsors will prepare for the TRAC Southwest Public Hearing on September 25th. The final project scores and rankings will be presented to the MVRPC Board of Directors on September 4th for adoption.



Moving Ahead

June 5, 2014 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

1. Federal Funding Update

The debate on the next federal transportation bill continues. The current bill, MAP-21, is a 2 year funding authorization bill that expires September 30 of this year. The prior three transportation funding bills were 6 year bills helping states, local jurisdictions, and the industry plan and program needed infrastructure over approximately 20 years. Thus far, the following transportation bills have been proposed:

- GROW America Act proposed by the Obama Administration, a 4 year, \$302B transportation
 proposal, a significant increase over MAP-21 levels and focused on job creation, innovation, and
 continuation of the TIGER grant program, and renewed investment in freight and logistics.
- A bi-partisan bill passed the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee, co-authored by Sen. Boxer (D-CA) and Sen. Vitter (R-LA). This is a 6 year bill that continues current funding plus inflation over the 6 year period. The bill extends many of the initiatives launched by MAP-21.

Neither proposal fully addresses the declining revenue trend of the Highway Trust Fund (HTF), which is forecast to run out of money by August. As proposed, each requires additional funding (\$100B for the Senate bill) to supplement the ailing HTF. In the past, the funding has come from the General Fund, an unreliable source for transportation funding due to the many needs confronting the country. Transportation needs are best served through healthy, dedicated funding sources, traditionally federal and state gas tax, tolls, and infrastructure bonds. From House Republicans, the latest idea to supplemental funding is to use savings from ending Saturday mail delivery which would fund only 1 year of the funding shortfall. The Administration cites an infusion from the general fund coupled with Corporate tax revisions. The deadline is an agreement before HTF depletion and MAP-21 expiration.

2. Recent Community Meetings

The Executive Director has concluded a recent round of meetings in the Region with current and former members about our vision and the services that we provide as a component of their membership in MVRPC. Emphasis is placed on the many reasons to get involved in MVRPC above and beyond project funding for their eligible road, bridge, transit, bicycle and pedestrian projects.

The primary reasons for active participation in MVRPC are to gain access to: a) dialogue and discussion on broad topics that transcend jurisdictional boundaries, b) MVRPC staff is an extension of local jurisdiction staff, c) MVRPC is a strategic resource and partner for advice, grant seeking and grant writing for the long term health of the region, d) participation in upcoming tools from the region's visioning process which concluded in April 2014, e) storm and sanitary sewer best practices, and f) land use, transportation services, and data to support local and regional initiatives.

These discussions have occurred with the following during the 2nd Quarter: Preble County, Darke County, Greene County Township Association, Greene County Engineers Annual meeting, Montgomery County Engineer's Annual Meeting, Franklin Township (Warren), First Suburbs, Miami Township (Montgomery), Xenia Township (Greene), and Butler Township (Montgomery).

In addition, MVRPC has been included in the Partnership Initiative launched by Wright Patterson Air Force Base through the office of Commander Barlow. Our role is to serve as Senior Advisor to the transportation committee for this initiative and I'll be a signatory in the formal partnering agreement. After employee performance reviews and summer vacation, we'll resume these meetings. Please contact Ann Burns to schedule a meeting in your community.
