I. INTRODUCTION

Chair Geyer called the meeting to order. Self-introductions were made.

II. APPROVAL OF JULY 24, 2014 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Davies made a motion to approve minutes. Mr. Hammes seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

None

IV. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Recommended Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 3 of the mailout explaining that numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects has resulted in the need for a TIP amendment. He referred to the project tables for each county as well as the areawide projects. Mr. Arnold stated that staff does recommend adoption of this TIP amendment, and referred to a resolution on page 9 of the mailout. Ms. Swan made a motion to recommend adoption. Mr. Conway seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Recommended Approval of MAP-21 Funds Availability Report and Project Solicitation Request

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 10 of the mailout. He explained that MVRPC funding policies require the staff to provide an annual information report showing the status of regionally controlled STP, CMAQ and TA funds as part of the solicitation process. He noted that there are no current CMAQ funds shown since that has switched to a statewide program. Mr. Arnold reviewed the table on page 11 which provided the fund balances for STP and TA federal programs. Based on this report, staff recommends authorization to begin the solicitation process for new STP, CMAQ and TA projects. Mr. Bergstresser made a motion to approve. Mr. Snyder seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

C. Recommended Approval of Updates to STP-CMAQ-TA Policies and Procedures

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 12 of the mailout defining some minor changes that were made to the draft STP-CMAQ-TA Policies and Procedures. He briefly reviewed the proposed changes to the policy which are indicated by bold print. The three biggest changes were regarding the ODOT carry-over reduction program, the SIB Loan Repayment policy and the new acronym table. He announced that there would be an instructional seminar for project applications following the September TAC Meeting. Ms. Swan made a motion to approve. Mr. Conway seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

D. Recommended Approval of FY2014 Work Program Completion Report

Mr. Daniel referred to a memo on page 34 of the mailout explaining that this completion report is done annually and it summarizes the highlights of the MPO's efforts for the preceding fiscal year. The report is included for review in the mailout beginning on page 35. He stated that staff recommends the resolution on page 51 be forwarded to the Board of Directors for adoption. Mr. Bergstresser made a motion to recommend approval. Mr. Conway seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

E. Recommended Approval of FY2014 TRAC Projects

Mr. Daniel provided some history of how the TRAC process was established. He explained that Metropolitan Planning Organizations MPO's, such as MVRPC have several responsibilities and tasks to fulfill before a project can be considered by the TRAC.

- 1. Projects must be included in the MPO's Long Range Plan
- 2. MPO's are required to consider regional and local priorities and submit project priority lists to the TRAC.
- 3. No project will be ranked by TRAC unless approved or reviewed and commented on by the appropriate MPO.

Mr. Daniel reviewed the policies and procedures including the TRAC ranking system. He explained that the TRAC projects we received were reviewed and scored by MVRPC staff, and agreed upon by the Project Sponsors to determine the final scores at the Project Sponsor meeting. The final scores and projects of this year's TRAC process were:

 MOT – US35 Improvements 	Score – 71
2. GREENE – US35 Interchanges	Score – 59
3. 70/75 Airport Logistics Access	Score – 51

Staff and TAC recommend the Board adopt the resolution on page 56 approving the list of scored projects. Mr. Norton made a motion to approve. Mr. Bergstresser seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. MVRPC GIS Resources

Mr. Harner provided a demonstration on resources available through the MVRPC Website. He referred to the GIS resource page explaining how GIS is one of the key components of its Planning Support System that provides a vital operating function in conducting regional planning activities. He explained the resources available through the map gallery which include 6 categories of web maps: Boundaries, Census, Environment, Going Places, Transportation and OPSS (Online Planning Support System). Mr. Harner also demonstrated the layer packages available to develop personalized maps. He also explained the online planning support system available as well as information from the US. Census data center. Mr. Harner also stated that MVRPC Staff is always available to assist with all of these resources.

VI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin announced that a DRG Sustainability Roundtable Meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, September 18th immediately following the TAC Meeting. Lunch will be provided and there is room for about 15 more participants. If interested please contact Bob Steinbach.

Mr. Martin referred pg. 56 which provided information on his August ED report. He provided an update on the current transportation funding bill, MAP-21, which was recently extended by Congress The bill averts a shortfall of the federal highway account, prevents the USDOT from delaying payouts to states for large scale highway projects and extends the funding authorization until next May. He also reported on the progress of the activities related to the upcoming move of administrative offices. The goal is to be moved sometime in mid-October. Mr. Martin announced that MVRPC sponsored a table for the OARC Gubernatorial Event in Columbus on Friday, August 22, which he and Board members will be attending.

VII. ADJOURN

Mr. Norton made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Thuma seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

WHEREAS, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2014-SFY2017 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 2, 2013; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC, ODOT and Greene CATS have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2014-SFY2017 TIP amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2014-SFY2017 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #14** to the <u>SFY2014-SFY2017 Transportation Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

Subject: FY2016 Dayton Development Coalition's Priority Development and Advocacy

Committee Process

The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is working with other organizations throughout the Miami Valley to identify projects that may be eligible for funding. We will be working with the Dayton Regional Priority Development and Advocacy Committee, which has developed a process to evaluate projects and establish a list of regional priorities and recommended projects that aids the community in speaking with one voice when pursuing funding opportunities. Solicitation for new projects will start October 16th, and through a committee decision, the top projects will be forwarded on to pursue funding opportunities.

The purpose of this process is to establish a list of projects which benefit the Dayton Region to be submitted as requests for funding. The intent of this process is to present the list in a timely fashion in a format that is useful and contains projects that are mature and potentially eligible for funding.

MVRPC is the lead agency for Transportation projects and Government Services projects. Transportation projects include any surface, air, rail, transit, and pedestrian transportation-related projects. Government Services projects include and criminal justice, first responders, community and neighborhood infrastructure, and K-12 education projects. The Transportation projects and Government Services projects will be reviewed by the MVRPC review panel. The MVRPC review panel will evaluate proposed projects by the importance of the project and by the impact the proposed project will have in the overall area. The list of recommended priorities will then be sent to the MVRPC Board for final review and adoption followed by submittal to the Dayton Regional Priority Development and Advocacy Committee.

The Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee will take the approved project list and pursue funding for the Dayton Region projects. Project sponsors who agree to participate in the process are expected to support the overall priority list. Sponsors of any projects, no matter where it appears on the priority list, are under no obligation to limit their own advocacy activities in support of their project, as long as they acknowledge the priority list.
