### I. INTRODUCTION

Chair Gruner called the meeting to order. Self-introductions were made.

### II. APPROVAL OF APRIL 16, 2015 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Geyer made a motion to approve minutes. Mr. Amrhein seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

### III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

### IV. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

# A. Recommended Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold referred to a handout since this agenda item was added after the mailout was distributed. He referred to the one project on the Greene County table for US68. Mr. Arnold stated that staff does recommend adoption of this TIP amendment, and referred to a resolution included in the handout. Mr. Geyer made a motion to recommend adoption. Mr. Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

### V. INFORMATION ITEMS

### A. 2015 Update of the Congestion Management Process

Ms. Parikh presented an overview of the Congestion Management Process Technical Report which was completed by MVRPC in May 2015. The report was produced to update the progress of the Region's congestion management strategies and integrate it into MVRPC's transportation planning processes. She mentioned that the 2015 CMP report was redesigned to include a number of new features including corridor level performance measurements, development of a regional report card, peer city comparison of congestion performance measures and development of a toolbox of congestion management strategies in accordance with performance measurement and reporting requirements of the MAP-21 legislation.

Ms. Parikh presented several examples of performance measures used by MVRPC to measure recurring and non-recurring congestion in the Region including level of service, corridor travel time reliability, mobility, safety and accessibility measures, as well as identification of congested corridors in the Region. She explained that MVRPC follows a multimodal approach to addressing congestion in the Region through completion of the Regional Bikeway Plan, Freight Movement Study, keeping track of transit routes and ridership as well as incorporating various sustainability/livability initiatives in its transportation planning process such as RIDESHARE, regional land use plan and travel demand management.

Ms. Parikh reported that MVRPC's most direct roadway congestion mitigation measures are multimodal capital transportation projects and improvements that increase capacity, safety or efficiency of the road network. These are incorporated into MVRPC's 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). Ms. Parikh noted that the 2015 Congestion Management Process Technical Report and the Congestion Management Process Brochures are available on MVRPC's website at <a href="http://www.mvrpc.org/transportation/long-range-planning-lrtp/congestion-management-process">http://www.mvrpc.org/transportation/long-range-planning-lrtp/congestion-management-process</a>.

### B. Miami Valley Bike Counting Program Assessment

Mr. Peters presented information on a new MVRPC program to begin collecting bicycle counts. He explained that it's important to begin collecting bicycling counts so that bicycle usage across the Region can be measured and tracked. Bicycle counts help support decision making and prioritization of funds for new bicycle infrastructure. MVRPC will become a one-stop repository for bicycle count information. Mr. Peters stated that the Region's trail management agencies have permanent automatic counters that collect trail counts on the bikeway. Annually, MVRPC will collaborate with those agencies to compile their data. Additionally, he explained that MVRPC has purchased two automatic counters that collect bicycle-only counts. MVRPC will temporarily install those counters on on-road bike lanes and the sections of bikeway for 7-days and conduct short-term count studies. Finally, Mr. Peters explained that MVRPC members can borrow the bicycle-only counter to perform short-term studies in their own jurisdictions. # C. Update on TRAC Solicitation

Mr. Daniel announced that the 2015 TRAC Application Cycle opened on Thursday, May 28, 2015 and will close on Tuesday June 30, 2015. TRAC Applications are web based, only available through the TRAC website. He explained that during the 2015 application cycle, TRAC will only accept applications that meet one of the following criteria:

- 1. The project is an existing TRAC funded project (Tier I, II or III) and additional funds are needed to advance the project to the next stage of development.
- 2. A new project which has not previously applied for TRAC funding that demonstrates significant impact to jobs in Ohio as well as a regional/statewide economic impact.

### VI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin noted that the Congestion Management Brochures were provided as a handout at the sign-in table and the full report is available on the website. He also noted that much of the mailout is now featuring the new MVRPC logo, and the new website will be live tomorrow, May 22. He reviewed the new website, explaining that the link provided in the email will direct members to the "Committee Center" page where the meeting materials can be found. Mr. Martin introduced two new summer interns who will be working at MVRPC. He provided a report from the MVRPC Annual Spring dinner held on April 22, announcing that Jerry Hirt, Bethel Twp. Trustee was the recipient of the Regional Steward Award. Mr. Martin also shared information on the launch of the Dayton Link Bike Share Program, which happened on May 5<sup>th</sup> at Courthouse Square. His report also provided a list of upcoming meetings.

### VII. ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Geyer made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Peters seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**WHEREAS**, the SFY2016-SFY2019 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 7, 2015; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC and ODOT have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2016-SFY2019 TIP amendment; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

**WHEREAS**, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2016-SFY2019 TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #2** to the <u>SFY2016-SFY2019 Transportation Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

**Subject:** CY2015 TRAC Applications Submitted within the MVRPC Region.

Solicitation for ODOT Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) projects began on May 28, 2015. As of the June 30th application deadline, MVRPC received two applications, which include:

<u>Project</u> <u>Sponsor</u> <u>\$ Requested</u>

1. <u>Greene US 35 Interchanges Project</u> <u>ODOT D-8 / Beavercreek</u> <u>\$32.0 mil</u>

This project consists of the elimination of the five (5) at-grade intersections between Shakertown Road and the Xenia Bypass through the construction of new interchanges at Factory Road/Orchard Lane and Valley/Trebein Roads. The sponsor is requesting that the portion of the project that contains the Factory/Orchard section remain on Tier 2 and requesting \$6 million for R/W Acquisition. The sponsor is requesting \$26 million for the portion of the project that contains the Valley/Trebein for Construction. This will allow the efficient use of remaining project funds to achieve a buildable project that encourages economic growth and addresses transportation concerns in the US 35 corridor.

2. Montgomery US 35 Improvements ODOT D-7 \$29.52 mil

This project will consist of major pavement rehabilitation of the existing U.S. 35 mainline and include construction of an additional lane in each direction from Livingston Avenue to the Montgomery County and Greene County Line.

MVRPC staff started reviewing these prospective projects on June 30<sup>th</sup>. Staff will release the draft rankings to the project sponsors by the end of July. MVRPC staff will be hosting a Project Sponsor Meeting in the beginning of August at MVRPC's main office. Please contact Brad Daniel at 10 N. The purpose of this Project Sponsor meeting will be to answer any questions or discuss any discrepancies between the project sponsor and staff scoring, and to reach a consensus. Following the ranking of the projects, MVRPC staff and the project sponsors will prepare for the TRAC Public Hearing that will be held October 13<sup>th</sup> at ODOT Central Office. The final project scores and rankings will be presented to the MVRPC Board of Directors on September 3<sup>rd</sup> for adoption.

### 2015 TRAC Solicitation Process & Schedule

ODOT is currently soliciting for Major New Capacity (TRAC) projects. These are projects costing more than \$12 million, add transportation capacity, and are critical to the mobility, economic development, and quality of life of the citizens of Ohio. The 2015 TRAC Application Cycle opened on Thursday, May 28, 2015 and will close on Tuesday June 30, 2015. TRAC Applications are web based, only available through the TRAC website.

During the 2015 application cycle, TRAC will only accept applications that meet one of the following criteria:

- 1. The project is an existing TRAC funded project (Tier I, II or III) and additional funds are needed to advance the project to the next stage of development.
- 2. A new project which has not previously applied for TRAC funding that demonstrates significant impact to jobs in Ohio as well as a regional/statewide economic impact.

The purpose of this process is to establish a prioritized list of projects which will be submitted as the Region's requests for TRAC funding. The intent of this process is to present the list in a timely fashion in a format that is useful to the TRAC and contains projects that are eligible for funding.

- 1. The MVRPC staff will rank proposed projects by the importance of the project and by the impact the proposed project will have in the overall area.
- 2. The list of recommended priorities will then be sent to the MVRPC TAC and Board for final review and adoption and submittal to the TRAC.
