I. INTRODUCTION

Chairperson, Stephanie Goff called the meeting to order at 9:33 a.m. Roll call was taken.

II. APPROVAL OF OCTOBER 15, 2020 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Hankins made a motion to approve minutes. Mr. Gruner seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

IV. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Recommended Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY 2021-SFY 2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold referred to the amendment to the SFY 2021-2024 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He referred to the packet showing the tables broken down by county, as well as the statewide line item project tables. Mr. Arnold stated that staff recommends forwarding the resolution to the Board of Directors for adoption.

Mr. Turnbull made a motion to recommend forwarding the resolution to the Board of Directors for adoption. Mr. Bergstresser seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Proposed List of 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Congestion Management Projects; Summary of Public Participation Meetings (October 20-21) and Financial Analysis

Mr. Arnold reviewed the financial revenue projections for the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan including historical data sources, timeframes, and splits between operation maintenance and capacity projects.

Ms. Ramirez reviewed the public participation efforts for the proposed list of 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Congestion Management Projects. As part of the ongoing 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), MVRPC worked with local jurisdictions and coordinating agencies to identify Congestion Management Projects. The draft projects were presented at two virtual public participation meetings in October to solicit public input. The draft projects were also evaluated and reviewed by MVRPC staff using the Project Evaluation System.

Ms. Ramirez reviewed the recap of public outreach efforts to promote the meetings, and the resulting public input received. Ms. Ramirez stated that staff recommends forwarding the resolution to the Board of Directors for adoption.

Mr. Huelskamp made the motion to forward the resolution supporting the FAST Act Safety Performance Management Targets. Mr. Conway seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Proposed New Projects Requesting MVRPC's STYP, CMAQ & TA Funds

Mr. Arnold reviewed the proposed new projects requesting MVRPC's STP, CMAQ, and TA Funds. Mr. Arnold stated that a public involvement meeting to present the proposed new projects was held on November 5, 2020.

Mr. Arnold stated that after each project is ranked, a final list of recommended projects will be reviewed by the Technical Advisory Committee in February and then forwarded to the Board of Directors for final approval in March.

B. Going Places Implementation Tools Progress Update

Mr. Kim presented an update to the Going Places Implementation Tools.

Mr. Kim reviewed the tool: Regional Geographic Information System (GIS) and presented the notable regional GIS trends identified from the 2015 and 2019 regional GIS assessment survey.

Mr. Kim shared the progress being made on three specific projects: D-Hive Initiative, Tornado Recovery Dashboards, and Online Public Engagement Tools.

VI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin thanked the staff for continuing the work of the Agency.

Mr. Martin stated that he is thankful that HB404 to extend the approval of remote meetings until July 2021 has been approved by the Ohio Senate and has been sent to the House for approval.

Mr. Martin gave an update on the resolution on Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion. The resolution was tabled in August and after meeting with members the resolution was brought before the Board in October. It removes Supporting Racism as a Public Health Emergency. The goals and scope of the resolution did not change. The Resolution passed unanimously on October 1, 2020.

Mr. Martin announced the passing of Michael Colbert, Sr., father of Montgomery County Administrator Michael Colbert, and suggested reading the obituary, stating that Mr. Colbert Sr. was a legend in the Miami Valley Region.
