How We Advance Regionalism:

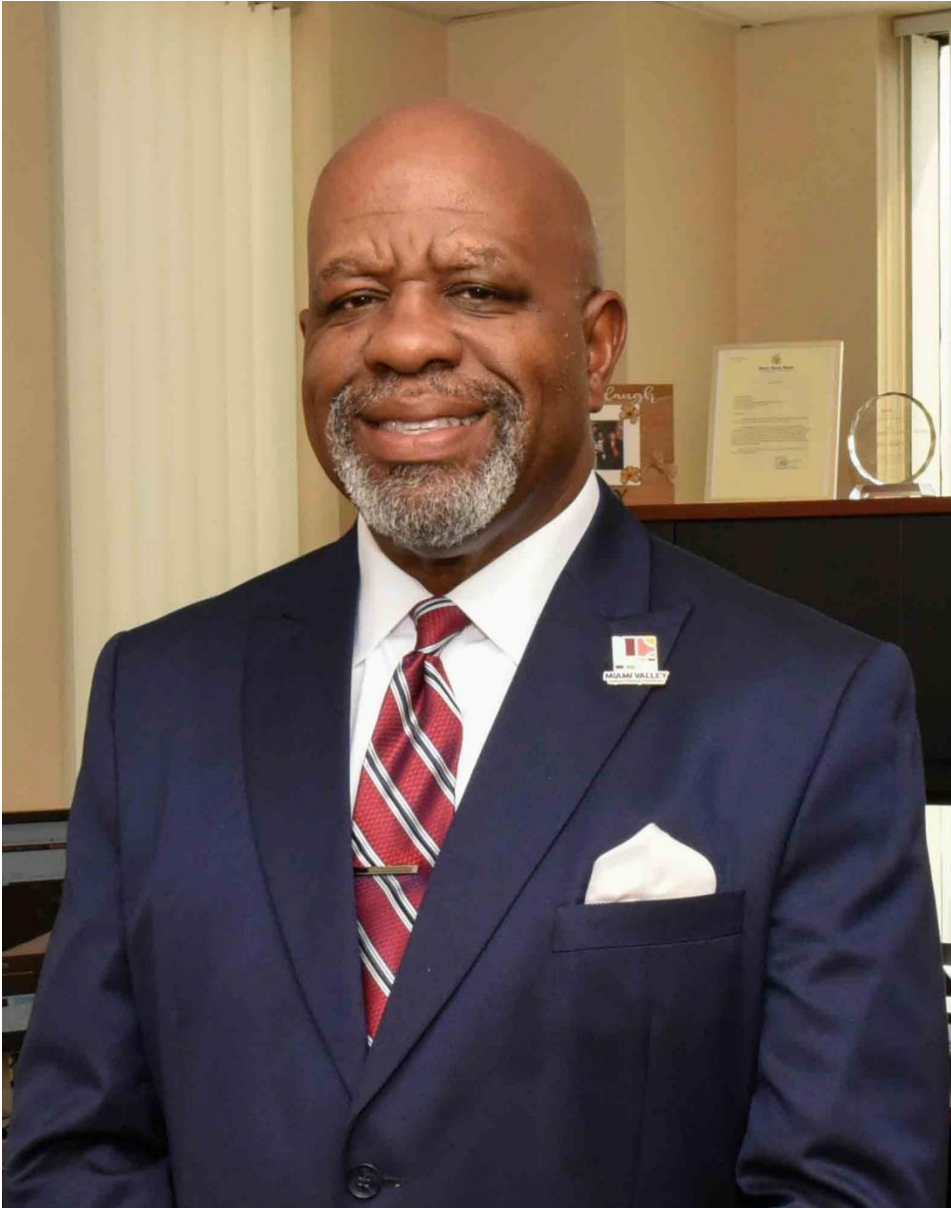

MVRPC is a unit of local government serving six counties in Southwestern Ohio. Its current operating budget is nearly \$6 million which includes a staff of 27 and a 105 member Board of Directors.

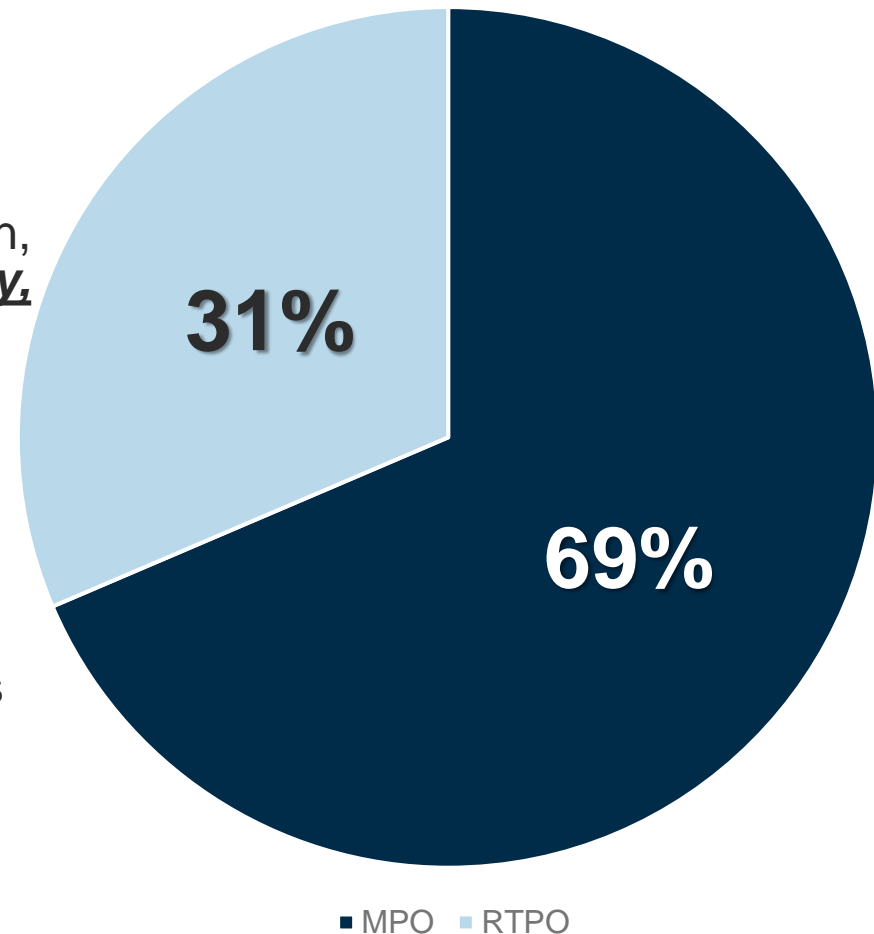
MPO

- **Regional Transportation Planning Organization** a designation given to the Commission in accordance with federal and state regulations for the purpose of conducting the nonmetropolitan transportation planning process for **Darke, Preble, and Shelby Counties.**

Governmental Members

1. Annual Member Dues

2. Resolution of Cooperation needed for all Governmental Members



Non-Governmental Members

1. Annual Member Dues
 - a) Non/Other Governmental Members- Dues are a flat fee of \$1,250

2. The Board of Directors may at any time, or from time to time, appoint additional “non-governmental” or “other governmental” members to the Board of Directors who may be persons nominated by non-governmental organizations or other governmental organizations deemed by the governmental members to be fairly representative of groups or interests having substantial interests in and impact upon the Miami Valley.



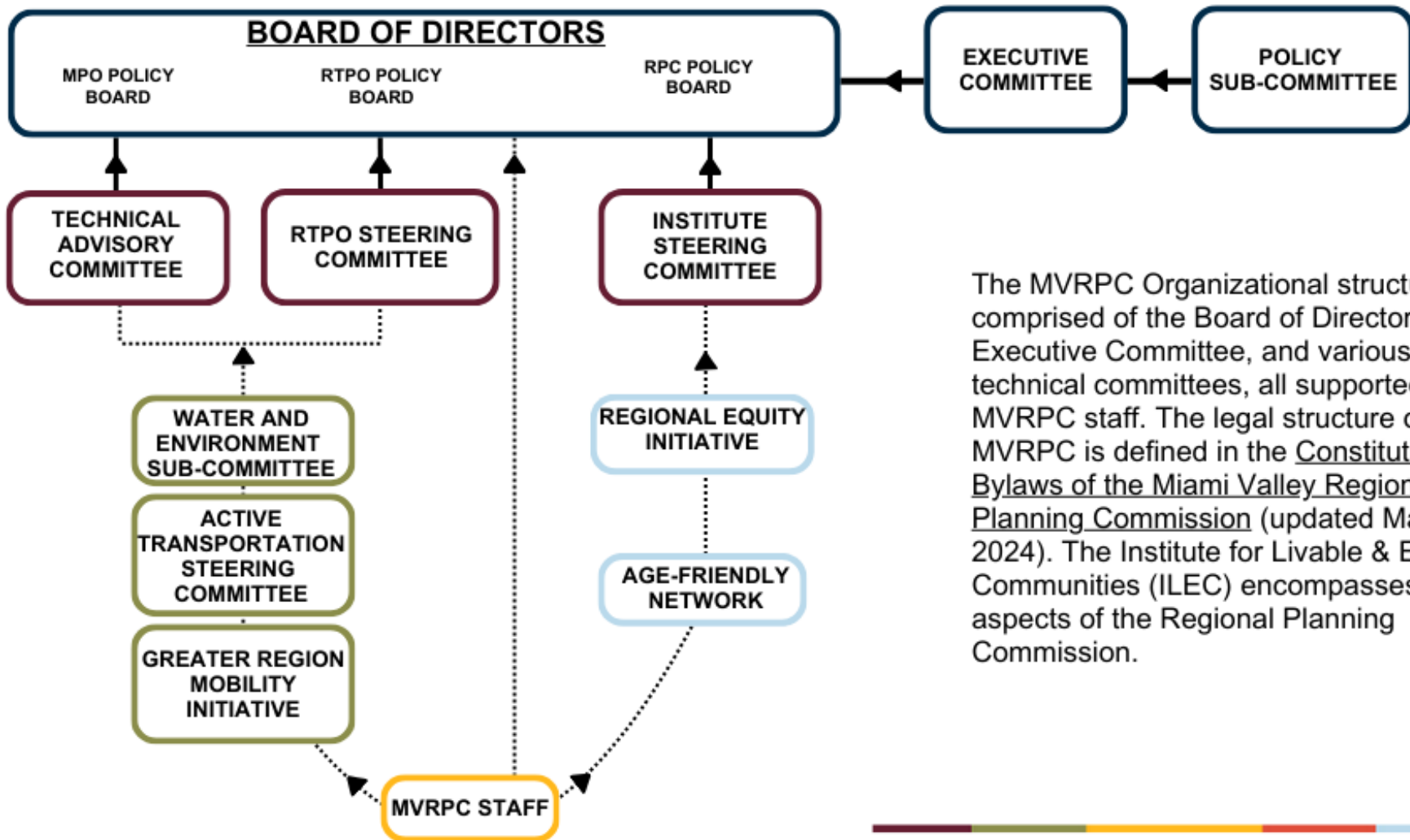

The role of the Board of Directors is to oversee the activities of the Executive Director and staff of MVRPC, to ensure they are carrying out the vision, mission, values and goals of the agency. The Board of Directors roster is made of up one representative appointed by each member organization.

The Board meets the first Thursday of each month 9 a.m. on the second floor of the Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main St., Dayton.

MVRPC Officer Selection Process

- **Selection Process:**

- Officers are elected during the March Board Meeting.
- The Nominations Committee reviews applications and recommends a slate of officers for Board approval.
- Only **governmental members** of the Board of Directors are eligible to serve as officers.
- The slate must include at least one **MPO member** and one **RTPO member** among the four officer positions.
- Elected officers serve a **one-year term** (April – March).

- **Nomination Requirements:** *Interested Board Members must submit:*

1. Resume, including name and elected office held.
2. Experience in intergovernmental cooperation.
3. Position sought (Chair, First Vice-Chair, Second Vice-Chair, or Third Vice-Chair).
4. Date on which their current elected term expires.
5. Years of service on the MVRPC Board.
6. Statement on MVRPC's role in regionalism, cooperation, and problem-solving.

- **Officer Responsibilities:**

- **Chairperson:** Leads meetings, signs resolutions, and represents the Board.
- **First Vice-Chairperson:** Serves as Secretary, signs meeting minutes, and assumes Chair duties when needed.
- **Second Vice-Chairperson:** Provides fiscal oversight and steps in when higher officers are absent.
- **Third Vice-Chairperson:** Represents the RTPO Steering Committee and assists with agency leadership.

Officers are expected to attend Board and Executive Committee meetings, participate in policy discussions, and support regional initiatives. They also lead and conduct the Executive Director's annual performance review.



Executive Committee



Executive Committee

The Executive Committee is a subset of the Board of Directors, appointed annually to work with the Executive Director on personnel matters and financial expenditures.

The Executive Committee meets the first Thursday of each month 8:30 a.m. on the second floor of the Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main St., Dayton.



Executive Committee

- **Selection Process:**

- The Executive Committee members are selected immediately following the Board Meeting through caucuses.
- Only the **Member Delegate** of the Board of Directors is eligible to serve; alternates are not eligible.
- Selected representatives serve a **one-year term** (April 2025 – March 2026).
- Jurisdictions must have a valid Board of Directors designation form on file and paid MVRPC membership dues to participate.

- **Automatic Members:**

- The **Chair, First Vice-Chair, Second Vice-Chair, and Third Vice-Chair** (elected during the March Board Meeting).
- One representative from the **largest populated city in the region** (City of Dayton).
- One representative from **each member County (Commission)**.

- **Caucus Selection Guidelines:**

- Representatives in each category are chosen by Board Members in attendance from the same category.
- Selection can be made by **collective decision** or **paper ballot vote**.
- If selecting three representatives (e.g., Non-Governmental Members or Additional Cities/Villages Members), a standard public election-style ballot is used.

- **Designation of Executive Committee Seats:**

- **Counties (6 Members)** – One representative from each member County.
- **MPO Cities & Villages (9 Members)** – Includes the City of Dayton, one representative from each MPO county, and four additional members (no more than five from the same county).
- **MPO Townships (3 Members)** – One representative from each of the three MPO counties.
- **MPO & RTPO Non-Governmental Members (3 Members)** – Selected separately from Non-Governmental Board Members.

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment is consistent with the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2024-SFY2027 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts Amendment #14 to the [SFY2024-SFY2027 Transportation Improvement Program](#) as shown on the attached TIP Tables.



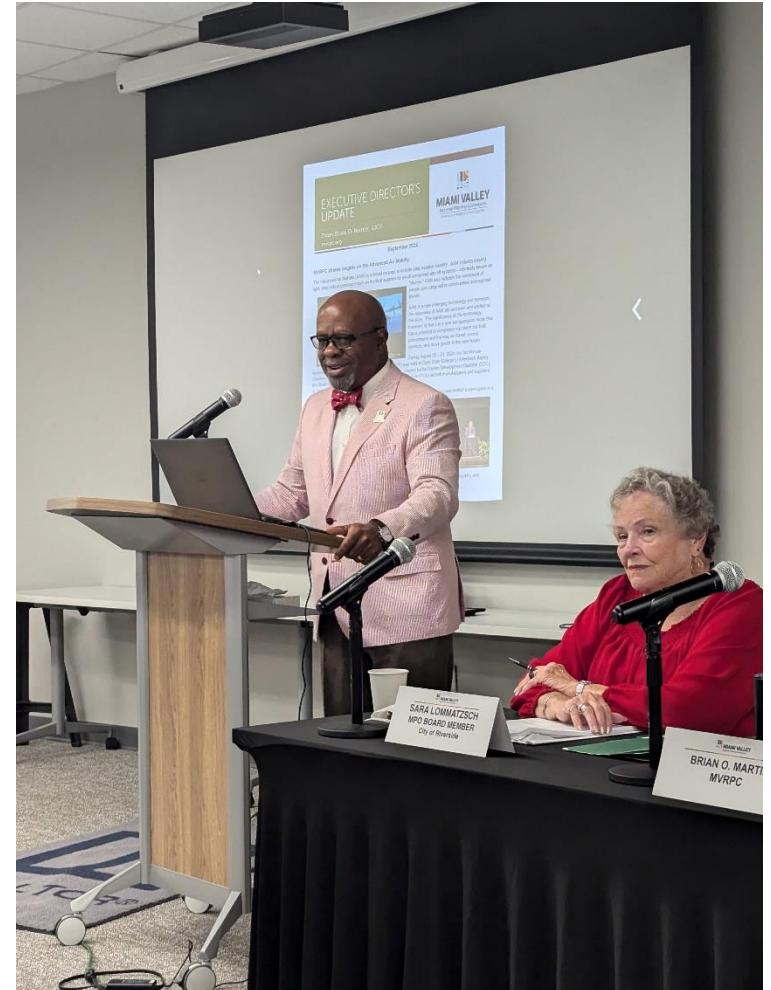

Additionally, we expanded our membership by welcoming the Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association, Ohio EPA and Drive Electric Dayton, reflecting our commitment to broadening partnerships across the region. Thanks to the Board's leadership, we made great strides this year that will have a lasting impact on the Miami Valley Region.

TRANSPORTATION PLANNING & FUNDING

In CY 2023, MVRPC's Board of Directors awarded \$49.7 million in federal transportation funds for forty-three (43) roadway, traffic, bikeway, transit, transportation alternatives, and planning projects. MVRPC's regionally-controlled Surface Transportation Program (STP), Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ), Carbon Reduction (CR), and Transportation Alternatives (TA) grants will fund, when matched with local dollars, over \$76.3 million in transportation projects.

We continued to work with a consultant and local partners on the preliminary design and environmental phases of the EV Charger project. We chaired the Transportation and Government Services review panel of the Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) and participated on the Quality of Life and Economic Development review panels of PDAC which is led by the Dayton Development Coalition, a non-government member of MVRPC.
