OEMA / FEMA Update

FEMA Program Delivery Management team will be in place by early October to provide direct assistance to impacted jurisdictions for their public assistance applications. (Update: As of 10/10/19 FEMA teams are here and beginning their meetings with jurisdictions)

Individual Recovery Operations continue to move very quickly. Direct, one-on-one assistance for individuals and families now all routing through 211 number. There have been 105 calls in first few weeks of operation.

Local Disaster Recovery Manager Update

MVRPC is applying for Economic Development Administration (EDA) funds to provide a full time Disaster Recovery Manager who will be the coordinator of the long term recovery project for at least 5 years. This position will provide technical assistance to all jurisdictions and work to execute the recovery and resiliency strategy for the entire region.

MVRPC will also apply for EDA funds in partnership with the Dayton Development Coalition to develop a Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy for the Region.

Individual jurisdictions can, and should plan to apply for EDA Construction projects related to Disaster Recovery. These projects can repair and/or reinforce public infrastructure. Stacy will provide individual technical assistance to each jurisdiction who wishes to consider an application. The application is open and work should begin now to get projects submitted this calendar year.
