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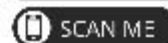

**Twitter declares it will relax ban on political advertising**

Twitter says it will ease up on its 3-year-old ban on political advertising, the latest change by Elon Musk as he tries to pump up revenue after purchasing the social media platform last year. The company tweeted late Tuesday that "we're relaxing our ads policy for cause-based ads in the U.S." "We also plan to expand the political advertising we permit in the coming weeks," the company said from its Twitter Safety account. Twitter banned all political advertising in 2019, reacting to growing concern about misinformation

spreading on social media. At the time, then-CEO Jack Dorsey said that while internet ads are powerful and effective for commercial advertisers, "that power brings significant risks to politics, where it can be used to influence votes to affect the lives of millions." The latest move appears to represent a break from that policy, which had banned ads by candidates, political parties, or elected or appointed government officials. Political advertising made up a sliver of Twitter's overall revenue, accounting for less than \$1 million of total spending for the 2018 U.S. midterm election.

**Musk slashes costs by falling behind on bills**

SAN FRANCISCO — Elon Musk is trying to slash expenses at Twitter as close to zero as possible while his personal wealth shrinks — and this apparently has included falling behind on rent payments at the company's offices. Twitter owes \$136,260 in overdue rent on its offices on the 30th floor of a building in downtown San Francisco, according to a lawsuit filed by the building's landlord last week. The landlord at 450 California St., which is not Twitter's main San Fran-

cisco headquarters, served a notice to the social media company on Dec. 16 informing it that it would be in default if it didn't pay within five days. The five days elapsed without payment, according to the lawsuit. The landlord, Columbia REIT 650 California LLC, is seeking damages totaling the back rent, as well as attorney fees and other expenses. Twitter signed a seven-year lease for the offices in 2017. The monthly rent was \$107,526.50 in the first full year and increase gradually to \$128,397 per month in the seventh year. Twitter did not respond to a message for comment.

**Sitting ducks? Military flaws seen in Russian troop deaths**

KYIV, UKRAINE — The Russian military's top brass came under increasing scrutiny Wednesday as more details emerged of how at least 89 Russian soldiers, and possibly many more, were killed in a Ukrainian artillery attack on a single building. The scene last weekend in the Russian-held eastern Ukrainian town of Makivka, where the soldiers were temporarily stationed, appears to have been a recipe for disaster. Hundreds of Russian troops were reportedly clustered in a building close to the front line of the war, well within range of the enemy's Western-supplied precision artillery, possibly sitting close to an ammunition store, and perhaps unwittingly helping Kyiv's forces to zero in on them. It was one of the deadliest single attacks on the Kremlin's forces since the war began more than 10 months ago and the highest death toll in a single incident acknowledged so far by either side in the conflict.

Ukraine's armed forces claimed the strike killed around 400 mobilized Russian soldiers housed in a vocational school building in Makivka. About 300 more of them were wounded, officials alleged. It wasn't possible to verify either side's claims due to the fighting. The Russian military sought to blame the soldiers for their own deaths. Gen. Lt. Sergei Severyukov said in a statement late Tuesday that their phone signals allowed Kyiv's forces to "determine the coordinates of the location of military personnel" and launch a strike.

Emily Ferris, a Research Fellow on Russia and Eurasia at the Royal United Services Institute in London, told the Associated Press it is "very hard to verify" whether cell-phone signaling and geolocation were to blame for the accurate strike. She noted that Russian soldiers on active duty are forbidden from using their phones — exactly because there have been so many instances in recent years of their being used for targeting, including by both sides in the Ukraine war. The conflict has made ample use of modern technology.

She also noted that blaming the soldiers themselves was a "helpful narrative" for Moscow as it helps deflect criticism and steer attention toward the official cellphone ban. Russian President Vladimir Putin sought to move the conversation along, too, as he took part via video link in a sending-off ceremony Wednesday for a frigate equipped with the Russian navy's new hypersonic missiles.

In the same post, the ministry said the building struck by Ukrainian missiles was little more than 7.5 miles from the front line, within "one of the most congested areas of the conflict," in the partially Russian-occupied Donetsk region.

The Russian military has a record of unsafe ammunition storage from well before the current war, but this incident highlights how unprofessional practices contribute to Russia's high casualty rate," the update added.

The Russian Defense Ministry, in a rare admission of losses, initially said the strike killed 63 troops. But an emergency crew sifted through the rubble of the building, the death toll mounted. The regiment's deputy commander was among the dead. That stirred renewed criticism inside Russia of the way the broader military campaign is being handled by the Ministry of Defense.

Vladlen Tatarsky, a well-known military blogger, accused Russian generals of "demonstrating their own stupidity and misunderstanding of what's going on (among the troops, where everyone has cellphones."

"Moreover, in places where there's coverage, artillery fire is often adjusted by phone. There are simply no other ways," Tatarsky wrote in a Telegram post.

Others put the blame on the decision to station hundreds of troops in one place. Unconfirmed reports in Russian media said the victims were mobilized reservists from the region of Samara.

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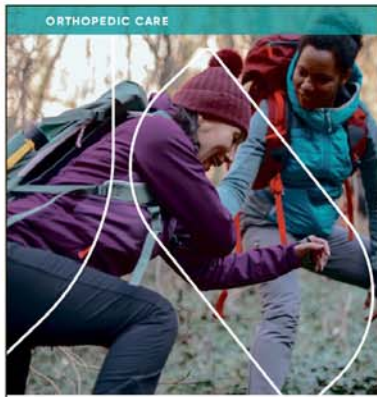

## MVRPC outlines possible transportation projects

Public can ask questions about what's on the list at virtual meeting Jan. 11.

The Midwest Valley Region of Transportation (MVRPC) has revealed its draft Transportation Improvement Program for the state fiscal years 2024 through 2027, which outlines transportation projects scheduled to be implemented over the next four years.

Specifically outlined in the TIP are the region's highways, bikeway projects and transit improvements that are federally and/or state financed.

Before local jurisdictions can move forward with proposed project implementation or construction, the projects must first gain approval for the use of federal or state dollars by MVRPC's board of directors and become part of the TIP, according to MVRPC Director Brian Martin.

"The TIP is like our check-book of projects... it's a working document," Martin said. "All of these projects have some type of federal (funding) commitment to them."



One of the larger projects included in the draft Transportation Improvement Program is a proposed to reconstruct a portion of U.S. Route south of the Warren/Midway County line to I-75, including the addition of a four-lane southbound, southbound, southbound.

### LARGE PROJECTS IN DRAFT TRANSPORTATION PLAN

■ **\$528.000.000** I-75 from south of the Cal. Green Highway exit to the north-ranched interchange - construct new area connected one to provide missing movement on the existing partial interchange at I-75 and Orange Hill Road

■ **\$50.000.000** I-75 From south of the Warren/Midway County line to I-75 - major reconstruction, including adding four lanes in each direction

■ **\$17.000.000** Transit improvements to accommodate increased transit traffic near Dayton airport

■ **\$1.200.000** State Route 125 at I-75 - convert the cross-avenue to a diamond interchange, upgrade traffic signal at Flyers Road and install sidewalk along SR 125

Public transit: There are multiple line items of \$12 million to \$2.5 million within the TIP plan for the Greater Dayton Regional Transit Authority (RTA) for facility upgrades, preventive maintenance and "transit guideway system" work. There's also an \$1 million line item for operating assistance to Greene County's Greene CATS public transit system.

## Local utilities rose to challenge of winter weather

In the face of record storms, how Ohio's energy grid stacks up

As national authorities from Ohio's electric utilities that happened across the country during a record setting storm over Christmas, local utilities say they are making investments to keep Ohio's electric grid up and running.

This is vital as extreme weather events are said to have increased in frequency, fueled by researchers' study on climate change.

The Midwest, dubbed "Winter Storm Eerie," swept across the United States and Canada and was felt as far south as Georgia over the course of a week around Christmas. Dayton saw to faster 12-hour temperature drops on record, falling 63 degrees total from 45 to minus 18, according to the National Weather Service in Wilmington, North Carolina. The coldest Christmas Day on record there 1997 with a high of 14 degrees, and the 8th coldest Christmas since 1951.

In Dayton, four midnight Thursday-night Weather-Ready 20,000 customers lost power, over all of the same time. AED Ohio spokesperson Mary Ann Kappel said. At one point late Thursday, AED Ohio reported more than 1,500 no power with no electricity, but crews quickly restored service to most of those affected. Ohio faces more than other parts of the nation, as energy infrastructure investments in the transmission network rolled back in 2011 might be necessary, but were never installed.

Police: Nurse took thousands of videos while sexually assaulting his patients

A former nurse at a Colorado hospital has been charged with sexually abusing female patients while they were unconscious and with recording the assaults on video, police said.

The former nurse, Christopher J. Lombardi, 66, has been charged with three counts of sexual assault, according to the Grand Junction Police Department. He worked for 40 years at St. Mary's Medical Center in

Grand Junction, which is about 80 miles west of Aspen, until he was fired after his arrest in October at the hospital.

Authorities have recovered about four terabyte drives of data — the equivalent of about 700,000 cell phone photos or about 65,000 hours of video — from Lombardi's devices, according to a clear action lawsuit against the hospital and the respective organization that operates it. The suit was filed on behalf of two patients whom they were charged by Lombardi.



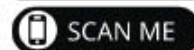

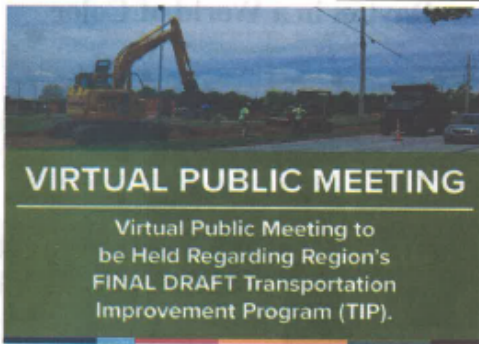

### How do the Schools Rank?

According to [publicschoolsreview.com](http://publicschoolsreview.com), the public schools in Montgomery County have "an average math proficiency score of 42% (versus the Ohio public school average of 50%), and a reading proficiency score of 52% (versus the 57% statewide average). Schools in Montgomery County have an average ranking of 2/10, which is in the bottom 50% of Ohio public schools." I spoke with several people in the Miami Valley and asked them their thoughts on this and received the following responses:

1) Michelle Tomlin who lives in Long Beach, California and is in law enforcement said, "I think you could have the most excellent teacher but if what they're putting out is not being received or reinforced through their support system it's like planting seeds on unfertilized ground. You're just throwing seeds on concrete. Demographically and socioeconomically, you're going to see that it has nothing to do with the teachers. I came from a single parent home but because of my mother, I didn't even know I had a choice not to go to college until I was in the 11th grade. It was ingrained in me. I literally thought that until some military recruiters said that if I wasn't going to college that their program might be for me. I really thought that you had to go to college the same way you had to attend Kindergarten through the twelfth grade.

It trickles down to these children. It makes a difference if their parents push their education. Why would students listen to the teacher when their parents feel that getting good grades is no big deal. I've seen it where you go in certain neighborhoods, and no one cares, no one is talking to the police and that is ingrained in the children. And then you go down the street to another neighborhood and everybody's like oh we're not tolerating this and there's some bad kids over there you know that there is a totally different mindset. Then they are carrying that with them when they're in schools. It's not fair to the teachers to hold them accountable to something that is not intrinsically being taught or reinforced in the home. Then everyone says that these teachers need to do a better job when these kids don't even have a proper support system.

2) Bill Miller who lives in the Miami Valley and owns Miller's Grind and Brew in the West Social, replied, "It's the textbooks. Different districts have different textbooks. There are different lessons in different textbooks. Dayton Public Schools has a different history book than Beavercreek and Centerville. When I was in school 30 years ago, we were taught something entirely different. Thirty years later we know that now to be true. Everything is starting to come out now. I truly believe that it is the textbooks and what we are being taught out of. Not all textbooks are created equal. Some are older, some are newer. Some are written different. Some have their own side of history in certain districts. The same history lessons, but there is a different story being told."
