

- Supported School Travel Plan Update in 2018
- Led Development of 2019 ODOT-Funded AT Plan
- Established as Village Advisory Committee in 2022
- Members Represent Local Government, Schools & Business as well as Other Key Stakeholder Groups

YS AT PLAN => FUNDING


Surface Transportation Program/MVRPC

- Holistic Approach Safety & Sustainability
 - Dayton Street Multimodal Path
 - Traffic Calming Curb Extensions, New Signage, Etc.
 - High Visibility Crossings, e.g. Little Miami Scenic Trail
- MVRPC Communication, Collaboration & Partnership
 - Actively Engage in AT Planning Efforts and Other Initiatives
 - Walking Audits, Trail Counts, Advisory Support, Etc.
 - ADA Improvements Downtown Intersection Domes/Ramps

Safe Routes to School/ODOT


- Building On Success & Maintaining Momentum
